

A MESSAGE FROM JBI HELICOPTERS TO ALL OF THEIR CUSTOMERS:

In an effort to streamline the administrative process of cranberry nutrient applications, JBI Helicopters has adopted an online-only nutrient work order model and has chosen BOGS Online as their selected platform. This means that any customer of JBI that wishes to utilize their services for the 2024 growing season will need to use CCCGA's BOGS system to place work orders. This includes any helicopter function that JBI provides to cranberry growers, including mud mats and fresh fruit bin lifting.

JBI Helicopters recognizes the importance of optimizing operations in cranberry farming. According to Kurt West, President of JBI Helicopters, the decision to transition to an online-only nutrient work order model aims to simplify, expedite, and eliminate errors in the process of nutrient applications, benefiting both growers and their pilots. After considering other application options, BOGS Online stood out as the ideal choice for JBI thanks to the platform's focus on the intricacies of Massachusetts cranberries, its user-friendly interface, helpful features, and seamless integration process. This ensures that cranberry growers working with JBI Helicopters can easily submit and manage nutrient work orders through a centralized and efficient system.

Over the coming weeks, JBI will be reaching out to growers as to why they made this decision and how growers can comply. JBI has stated that they will not be accepting any work orders except those generated through BOGS. This means no phone calls, faxes, or paper work orders will be accepted. Please be aware: BOGS Online can only be used by CCCGA members in good standing, so any grower that wishes to hire JBI this season will first need to join the Association and then purchase a separate BOGS subscription. CCCGA will help growers with membership, setting up BOGS, and any necessary training.

CCCGA did not have any part in JBI's decision to move online or in their selection of BOGS Online as their work order platform. This was an internal decision for JBI, and CCCGA has assisted with their online integration. BOGS was a tool that they identified as the best fit for them and their customers, and will overall help to better serve our members.





BOG RENOVATION TAX CREDIT UPDATE

Tom Anderson, program manager of the Cranberry Bog Renovation Tax Credit program, has provided an update. He said that applications are still being accepted for renovation projects from calendar years 2024 and 2023. 2022 may still be accepted but you should call him first to discuss. He is working on credits from qualified 2023 applications since tax filings will be happening soon. He's trying to work through as many of those as possible and then will be returning to any outstanding applications from previous tax years. After 2024, the bog renovation tax credit program will expire. CCCGA is working to extend the program, which will take a legislative effort. We'll have more news on the success of this initiative in the coming months.

WATER MANAGEMENT ACT ANNUAL REPORTS DUE

This is a reminder that MassDEP Water Management Act Annual Reports are due February 29, 2024. If you haven't filed your report yet, don't delay! Failure to turn in your report could result in the loss of your registration or permit. The report from MassDEP comes pre-populated for your convenience. BOG RENOVATION GRANT PROGRAM

Growers should now have heard from MDAR if you were accepted for the most recent round of bog renovation funding. At the suggestion of CCCGA, and based on grower feedback, MDAR was able to increase the per acre allotment, as well as the overall amount for the program.



UPDATES FROM THE CMC

CMC Annual Winter Meeting

The next meeting for the Committee is scheduled for February 15, 2024, and will be virtual only.

EU Tariffs

In December the U.S. and the European Union agreed to further extend the suspension of steel and aluminum tariffs until March 31, 2025. This avoids the potential re-imposition from January 1, 2024, of 25% EU tariffs on U.S. products, including cranberry concentrate and SDCs. This is not a permanent resolution of the dispute. Instead, it moves the deadline for the reintroduction of tariffs back until after the U.S. election cycle and aims to provide more space for negotiators to reach a permanent agreement.

CMC Termination

The proposed rule for the termination of the Cranberry Marketing Committee was published in the Federal Register (https://www.federalregister.gov/) on December 7, 2024. This proposed action invites comments on the proposed termination of the Federal marketing order regulating the handling of cranberries grown in the States of Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Jersey, Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota, Oregon, Washington, and Long Island in the State of New York and the rules and regulations issued thereunder (Marketing Order No. 929). The data collection, reporting and recordkeeping requirements applicable to cranberries not subject to the cranberry marketing order would also be terminated.

This proposed rule is intended to solicit input and other available information from interested parties on whether the Order should be terminated. USDA will evaluate all available information prior to making a final determination on this matter.
