

2025 Legislative Session MCPA Update

Week of February 10

Overview

The week of February 10th finally felt like a traditional week at the Capitol with both the Minnesota House of Representatives and the Senate convening on the floor and holding committee hearings. This was the first week the House carried out its agreement between the caucuses with Lisa Demuth serving as Speaker of the House, and Republican's holding the gavel for their respective committee chairs.

On Thursday, U.S. Senator Tina Smith announced she will not seek re-election in 2026. This is not directly correlated with the Minnesota Legislature; however, several potential candidates could cause a shakeup in state government if they are nominated. Soon after Senator Smith announced, Minnesota's Lieutenant Governor, Peggy Flanagan, announced she plans to run for the U.S. Senate seat. There has also been rumors of some Republican state senators and representatives that plan to run for the open seat come 2026.

Public Safety Committees

The Senate Judiciary and Public Safety Finance and Policy Committee's Wednesday hearing was informational for the following fleeing bills.

- <u>SF323 (Coleman)</u> Crime of fleeing a peace officer in a motor vehicle modified to add a heightened penalty for fleeing in a culpably negligent manner
- SF1224 (Latz) Fleeing from a peace officer crime provisions modifications
- <u>SF191(Gustafson)</u> Crime of fleeing a peace officer in a motor vehicle modification MCPA bill

The informational hearing included a walkthrough of each bill, the differences and similarities between the three, and public testimony. From MCPA, Chief Henthorne and Director Potts provided testimony on SF 191 as to why this bill would improve public safety on roads by minimizing the likelihood of a high speed chase along with how the use of a mobile tracking device would empower law enforcement agencies with the means to manage threats and reduce risks.

The House Public Safety Committee started the week by hearing <u>HF 7</u>. This bill modifies various public safety provisions in existing law related to data held by law enforcement agencies, agency custody notice requirements, mandatory minimum sentences, stays of adjudication, the Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission, legislative approval of Sentencing Guidelines, dismissing of charges, liability and vicarious liability, crime for trespass recruiting or educating, assaulting a police officer, fleeing in a motor vehicle, stolen motor vehicles, obstructing traffic, tracking devices, criminal penalties. There was no action taken on any of the fleeing legislation during the committee.

The bill received public testimony from law enforcement groups on sections of the bill that relate to their association's legislative priorities for this year. The Democrats on the committee raised many concerns with the legislation as presented before the committee; even so, the bill was passed out of



the Public Safety Committee on a party line vote and referred to the Judiciary and Civil Law Committee.

Next week:

The Senate committee will hear the following bills on Monday: <u>SF 0737 (Housley)</u> Mandatory fines enactment for violations of the school bus stop arm law and <u>SF 0505 (Mohamed)</u> Definition modification of investor seller. Following this week's passage out of the Public Safety Committee, <u>HF 7</u> with the Republicans public safety priorities will be heard in Judiciary and Civil Law Committee on Tuesday.
