

# **2025 Legislative Session MCPA Update**

Week of February 3<sup>rd</sup>

### **Overview**

On Thursday, February 6<sup>th</sup> the House Democrats returned to the chamber after refusing to come to the Capitol for nearly four weeks. Both parties have come to a power sharing agreement for the next two years. The agreement includes Republicans naming a speaker for the next two years and republicans to chair all House committees for the next month while they hold a 67-66 advantage. There will be some limitations on Demuth's power as speaker, and it requires 68 votes to pass any bill in the chamber, meaning proposals in the chamber must have bipartisan support.

This week Governor Walz called for a special election on March 11<sup>th</sup> for the safely blue Roseville-area seat. If voter turnout is as expected and the Democratic candidate wins, the chamber will be tied, 67-67. Once the House is evenly divided, Democrats and Republicans will co-chair the committees under the deal. The agreement also consists of former Democratic Speaker Hortman, who served as House speaker for the past six years, stepping back from the speakership in order to seat Rep. Brad Tabke, DFL-Shakopee.

Both Speaker Demuth and Leader Hortman have both noted the major work of this session will be passing a two-year budget agreement before the constitutional deadline to adjourn in May. Minnesota has a small projected surplus for the current two-year budget but is facing a possible \$5.1 billion deficit in 2028-2029.

## **Public Safety Committees**

The Senate Judiciary and Public Safety Finance and Policy Committee met on Monday. The committee heard several bills under the committee's jurisdiction and heard a presentation by the MN Department of Corrections on a departmental overview. Wednesday's hearing had presentations from MCPA and MPPOA on each association's legislative priorities for the year. MCPA 's Chief Jay Henthorne testified to walk through the associations priorities and share challenges the industry continues to face.

With the new House agreement, the House Republican lead, Rep. Novotny, on Public Safety Finance and Policy Committee will hold a hearing next week on the caucus public safety priorities legislation, <u>HF 7</u>.

The Senate Public Safety and Judiciary Committee is also scheduled to meet on Monday to hear presentations from the Department of Public Safety and from survivor support groups.
