

2025 Legislative Session MCPA Update Week of April 7

Overview

Friday, April 11th is the deadline for budget and finance focused bills to be through their committees and before the Ways and Means Committee, Taxes, or Finance Committee. Committee chairs spent this week putting together and holding hearings on their budget omnibus bills. They combed through what will be included and cut from their committee budget. Following Friday, the legislature will go on its Easter and Passover legislative break until April 21st.

Public Safety Committees

House

This week the House Public Safety Committee dedicated their hearings to hearing testimony and a walkthrough of their <u>Public Safety Committee Finance Omnibus Bill (HF2432)</u>. The bill received bipartisan support and now sits before the Ways and Means Committee.

Outlined below are items of interest to MCPA:

- 1. \$2,949,000 for peace officer training reimbursements
- 2. \$5.5M to Philando Castile Memorial Training Fund
- 3. \$2M for ICPOET

Senate

On Monday, April 7th the Senate Judiciary and Public Safety Committee heard <u>SF1701</u> (Duckworth), the bill that would appropriate \$6 million to the Philando Castile Memorial Training Fund. MCPA and the Minnesota Sheriffs Association both testified in support of the bill and reiterated to legislators the importance of the training reimbursement funds on law enforcement. The bill was laid over for possible inclusion in an omnibus bill.

The public safety committee also released their <u>finance omnibus bill (SF1417</u>). On Friday during their last hearing before the deadline, Chair Latz adopted additional amendments and made a motion to roll the policy provisions and the finance omnibus bill into one. It is important to note that even though these bills have moved out of their committee, there is still room for language and appropriation changes. The House and Senate Public Safety Committees will have to compare policy and finance omnibus bills and decide on a final version that will be signed into law.

Outlined below are items of interest to MCPA:

Policy:

- 1. To allow the use of mobile tracking devices on fleeing motor vehicles
- 2. Creation of buffer zone guidelines for first responders
- 3. Federal background checks by political subdivisions



4. "Chief" added to the definition of a public official when it comes to public data

Finance:

- **1.** \$2,949,000 for peace officer training reimbursements
- 2. \$2M for the biennium to Philando Castile Memorial Training Fund
- 3. Law enforcement required to register for e-trace system and trace and report on recovered

or confiscated firearms.
