

NAA ADVOCACY COMMITTEE

The Advocacy Committee shall serve as the advocacy arm of the National Auctioneers Association through:

- 1) Identification of national legislative and regulatory issues impacting the auction industry.
- 2) Prioritization of those issues to be included on the NAA Public Policy Agenda.
- 3) Proactive participation in the activities necessary to successfully advocate on behalf of members, including the annual NAA Day on the Hill.

Committee Composition:

- The Advocacy Committee will consist of the committee chair, vice chair, an executive committee liaison (if the chair/vice chair are not on the executive committee) and six members.
- The chair, vice chair and executive committee liaison shall serve a one-year term. The remaining six members serve three-year staggered terms, with two members rolling off the committee each year.
- The chair and vice chair will report to the NAA Board.
- Members, including chair and vice chair, will be selected and approved by the executive committee in coordination with the Chief Executive Officer.
- The CEO and one additional staff person will serve as liaisons to the committee.

Committee Competencies:

The following competencies have been identified for those who serve on the committee:

- Experience in advocacy-related activities
- Relationships with national elected and/or regulatory officials
- Passion for advocacy in the auction industry
- Commitment to NAA issues
- Staying informed and relaying information to the NAA about pertinent issues
- Critical thinking and problem solving
- Written and oral communications skills
- Individuals who take initiative
