








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Virtual Workshop

- Over 70 students Participated. Some students logged on from the home of fellow student.
- We wanted to create a virtual online environment for students to engage in learning like the classroom experience.
- We allowed students to have full technical control to get the highest percentage of engagement, including nonverbal cues, etc.

Virtual Workshop

- We used the Zoom platform with one host who was also the facilitator.
- We had three mentors to assist throughout the process.
- Overall this was a successful attempt; we must remember similar to traditional classrooms we want students to develop their knowledge in the subject area.

Recommendations:

- Pre-Workshop: Allow staff to get fully acclimated with virtual environment. Email parents the rules and workshop activity.
- Have multiple hosts to take control of various features (mic, video, login).
- Implement virtual rules/regulations early.
- Keep track of time (Have a timekeeper).
- Lessons should be short (demonstrate and perform the task).
- Ask parents to monitors students.
- Be patient! This is a new experience for everyone.

Final Thoughts

We must remember this is a new experience for everyone. Therefore, it's not so different from the traditional classroom. The interaction is different, so you have to think of how to be engaging with students.
