




Hotel Maps


Conference Level FOURTH FLOOR




Mezzanine Level SECOND FLOOR

Dear NACCE Friends:

Welcome to our 20th Anniversary Conference and to the Entrepreneurial College of the Future! Since NACCE's beginning at Springfield Technical Community College in 2002, we have stayed true to our mission of fostering entrepreneurship across academic



disciplines, among college departments, and throughout communities across the United States.

We highlighted many important milestones in the latest edition of the Community College Entrepreneurship journal, including:

- In 2002, 150 attendees from 102 community colleges came together for the first NACCE conference.
- By 2009, NACCE was attracting over 450 community college faculty and administrators to the annual conference.
- Between 2016 and 2021, NACCE awarded over \$11 million to member colleges and worked to expand the Everyday Entrepreneur Venture Fund (EEVF) that is now flourishing in 11 states.
- Between 2019 and 2021, NACCE published three books to provide thought leadership, practical applications, and stories of how community colleges can provide equity and opportunity for all.
- By 2022, the Forward with NACCE podcast reached people in 740 American cities and 50 countries around the world.
- In October of 2022, with support from the Philip E. and Carole R. Ratcliffe Foundation, \$300,000 in pitch prizes will be awarded to member colleges, the NACCE Innovation prototype will be launched, and a pilot NACCE Fellows program supported by a cohort of doctoral candidates from Morgan State University will be announced.

We are deeply grateful to our generous sponsors, NACCE's dedicated Board of Directors, talented staff, and scores of longtime and new members who are here with us in Boston to learn, network and celebrate.














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
