






- **100** Middle school students will participate per college










Roles & Responsibilities of Mentors





•Who: Jr. & Sr. Mentors only

•Where: Virtual platform called Chronus

•How Often: Meeting virtually monthly

•What: Sr. teaches Jr. curriculum

•Together: What is learned virtually is implemented into groups activities face to face



Skills

•Jr. will learn basics of goal setting

- •Sr. will mentor Jr. on personal development for HS aged learning
- Jr Mentors will be mentees via virtual curriculum to learn
- Jr. will assist Sr. Mentors in same activities face to face with middle schoolers
