

2021 Public Policy Agenda

- 1. Continue to monitor state and federal legislation. (Federal and State)
 - Monitor changes in the federal tax code to determine how it may impact the nonprofit sector
 - Monitor CARES ACT and additional COVID-19 legislation and funding
- 2. Nonprofits are critical to Nebraska's economy. We will share the story of the economic contribution nonprofits make with policy makers. (State and Federal)
 - Not only does every Nebraskan uses a nonprofit every single day, 1 in 11 Nebraska workers are employed by nonprofits
 - While nonprofits are exempt from state and federal income taxes, Nebraska nonprofits pay taxes, including sales, payroll, and property taxes.
- 3. Promote nonprofit sector civic engagement (State and Federal)
 - This work will encourage general civic engagement within the nonprofit sector including voter engagement, policy, and advocacy.
- 4. Continued Support and Implementation of 2020 Census (State and Federal)
 - Monitor 2020 Census Data and Reporting
 - Support Nebraska Redistricting efforts, if needed
- 5. Lead and advocate to strengthen social and fiscal policy and community development work Three crises are facing our country and communities today -- the pandemic, the resulting economic recession, and racial inequity -- intensifying the need for expanding beyond NAM's traditional nonprofit policy work. As we help to inform, educate, and access CARES Act funds, we must also lead and advocate to strengthen social policy and community development work. Our current crises illustrate the need to support a strong social safety net that supports equity inclusion.
