
Federal Impacts on Nonprofits



September 2025

In response to unprecedented federal funding cuts and numerous Executive Orders (EOs), the Nonprofit Association of the Midlands (NAM), the state association for charitable nonprofits in Nebraska, surveyed nonprofits to understand the impact on the vital work of community-based organizations across the state. NAM will continue polling nonprofit organizations monthly to track ongoing changes in the sector.

Survey Specifics: This survey was open from September 2nd–10th and received responses from 70 participants. The top three organizational types represented were Human Services, Education, and Public and Societal Benefit. Most respondents are based in Nebraska's urban centers of Omaha and Lincoln, with additional representation from mid-size cities such as Grand Island, Norfolk, North Platte, and Kearney, as well as rural areas including Valentine, O'Neill, and McCook. One response was also received from Iowa.
