- Overall Design & Aesthetic Appeal: How well does the project demonstrate creativity, innovation, and visual appeal?
- **Functionality & Space Optimization**: How effectively does the design enhance usability, flow, and overall functionality of the space?
- Craftsmanship & Quality of Workmanship: How well-executed are the construction details, materials, and finishing touches?
- Material & Design Innovation: How well-executed are the construction details, materials, and finishing touches?
- Impact & Client Satisfaction: How well does the final result meet the client's needs and goals?

- Overall Design & Aesthetic Appeal: How well does the project demonstrate creativity, innovation, and visual appeal?
- Historical Character: How well does the renovation maintain and complement the historical character of the structure?
- **Functionality & Modern Adaptation:** How effectively does the design balance historical features with modern-day usability and comfort?
- Craftsmanship & Quality of Workmanship:
