The primary shower, in this majestic 1913 home, leaked into the entry foyer below. After consulting a plumber, the clients were told that renovation was a must. The young, budget-conscious family of five hoped to retain the marble shower slabs original to the bathroom and preserve the integrity and beauty of the historic home, while updating functionality and gently nudging the bathroom into the current century.








The plan was to keep the marble slabs undisturbed, but a liner was required for waterproofing the new shower pan.



The marble shower slabs were removed with great care, trimmed, and reinstalled.



To prevent water damage the chair rail and wainscot were taken up and around the marble slabs to encase the showerhead.

FUNCTIONALITY The Marble Shower - Residential Historical Renovation Under \$250,000

- A glass door was added to the shower to retain heat
- Wainscot tile was taken up and around the marble to surround the showerhead
- A console vanity, with as much landing area as possible, was selected
- A new toilet replaced the unusually large existing toilet

• The toilet paper holder was brought down to a functional level





AESTHETICS AND HISTORICAL DETAILS The Marble Shower - Residential Historical Renovation Under \$250,000

- Cost-effective tile creates a traditional wainscot tile pattern, topped with chair rail
- Traditional deco tile adorns the floor
- Polished chrome fixtures keeps plumbing costs down, so cross handles at the sink and shower inject flair
- Original cabinet knobs were reused on the new linen closet
- A console vanity and vintage-looking light fixtures sustain the style of the home
- Original hand towel bars were reinstalled





UH OH MOMENT

To add function to the mirror area, a contemporary lighted medicine cabinet was installed with a face _____ frame surround. Complete fail!

A quick reworking with an oval mirror/medicine cabinet with the light fixture above complimented the space much more elegantly.
