REFINED RENEWAL

This remodel transformed a closed-off kitchen ~~into~~ into a bright, connected space balancing function and timeless beauty. Constraints such as existing windows and limited square footage inspired creative solutions, including removing walls for better flow, reconfiguring the powder bath and laundry to gain a functional mudroom, and adding a beverage bar in place of the pantry. Quartersawn white oak cabinetry, refinished floors, and curated finishes bring warmth and elegance, while floating shelves in front of windows showcase greenery to bring the outside in. Every detail elevates daily living while honoring the home's character.

- Modernize the laundry space

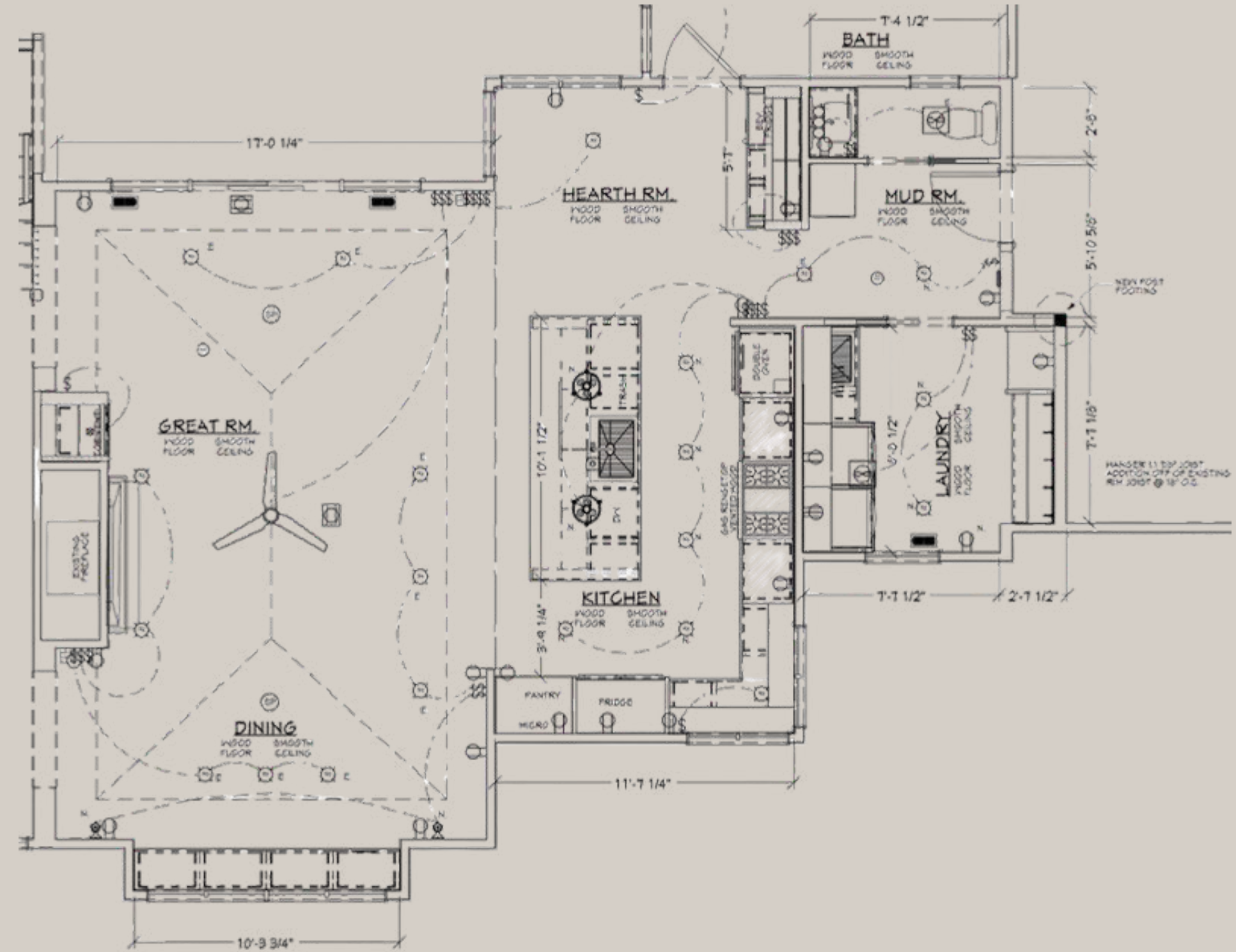
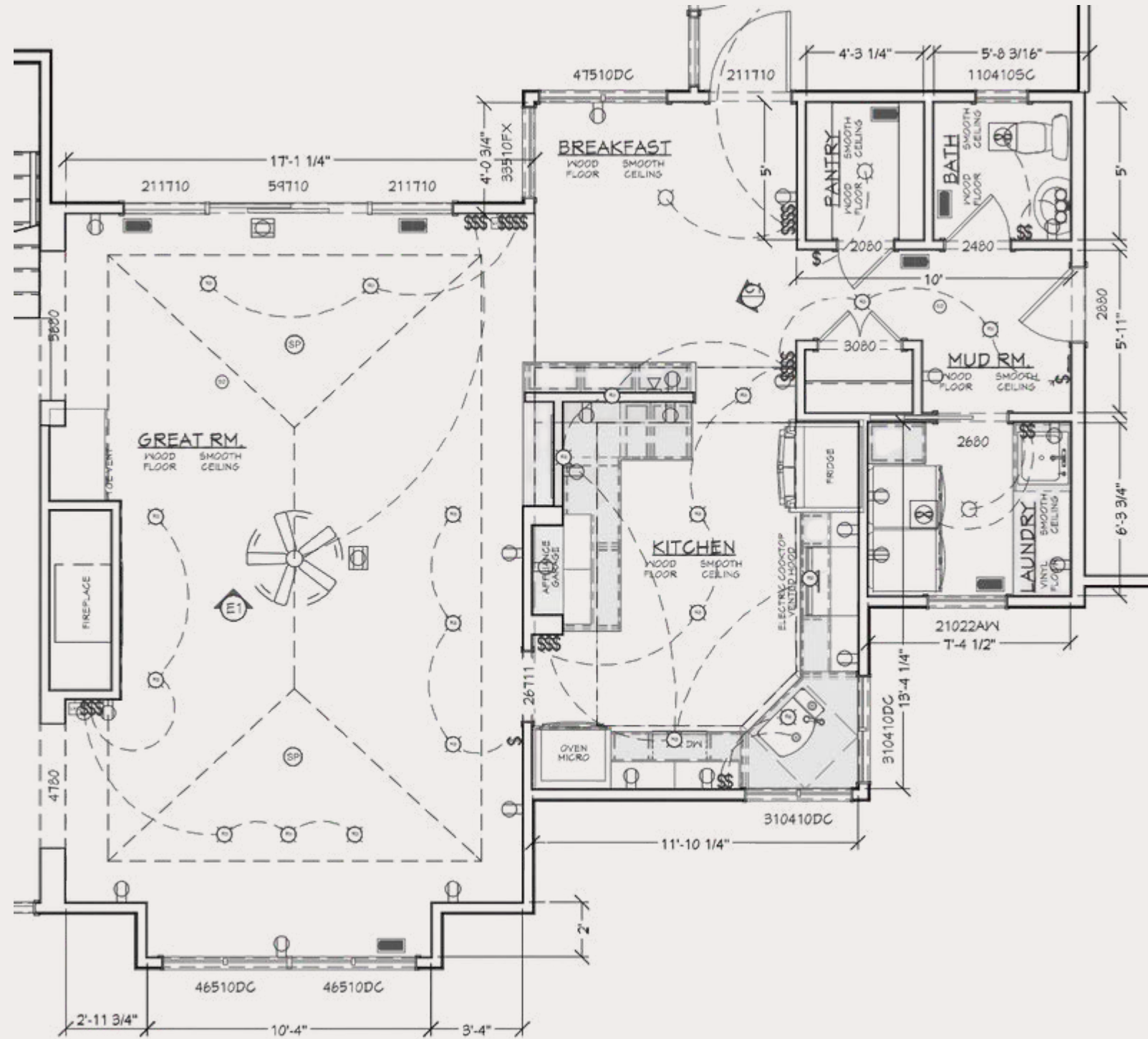
Design Challenges:

Before and after plans show how the kitchen walls were removed to create a fluid flow between spaces. Walls were expanded into the garage to install cubbies for storage and the bath was reconfigured to gain space in the rear entry.

REFLECTIONS

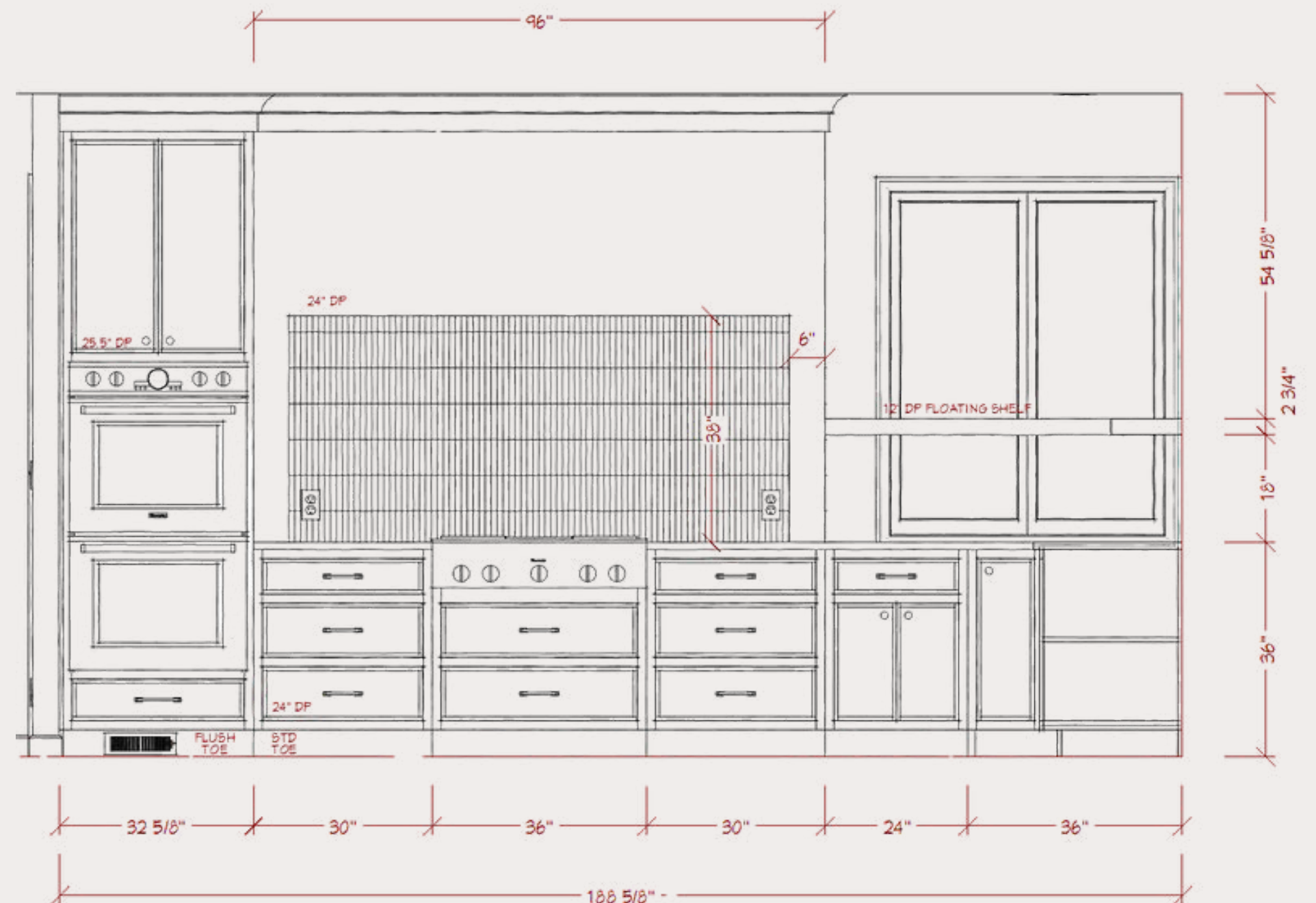


One of the primary design challenges was working within the constraints of the existing windows, requiring a creative approach to reimagining flow and function. By removing the wall that previously closed off the kitchen, the space now connects fluidly to the surrounding areas, inviting light and interaction throughout the home. The removal of a former pantry allowed for the addition of a walk-up beverage bar, adding both convenience and a refined focal point adjacent to the kitchen.



OUR VISION

Great detail went into the planning of this wall. From the width of the cooktop and the adjacent appliances to the depth of the floating shelves in relation to the light bloom from the recessed cans. The subtlety of the backsplash tile serves as a calming backdrop for the bodacious hood and the proper storage for the cook.

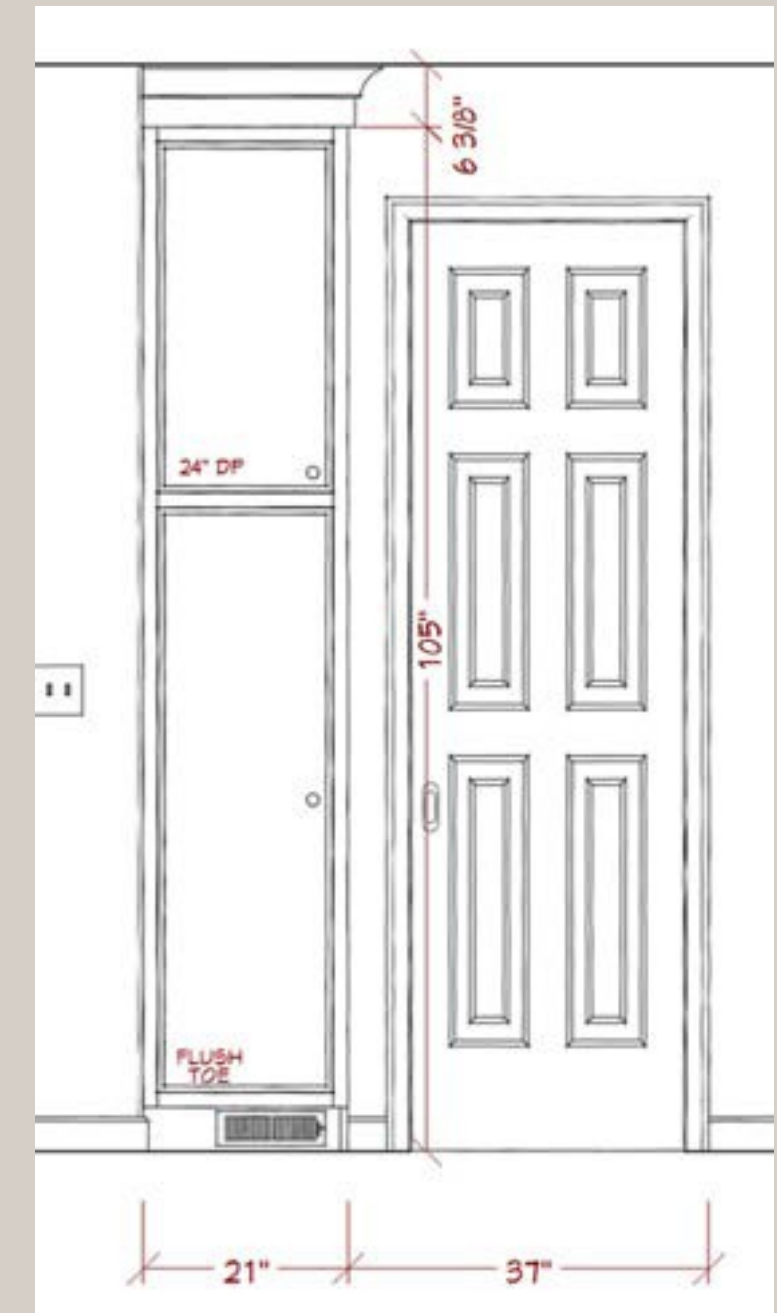
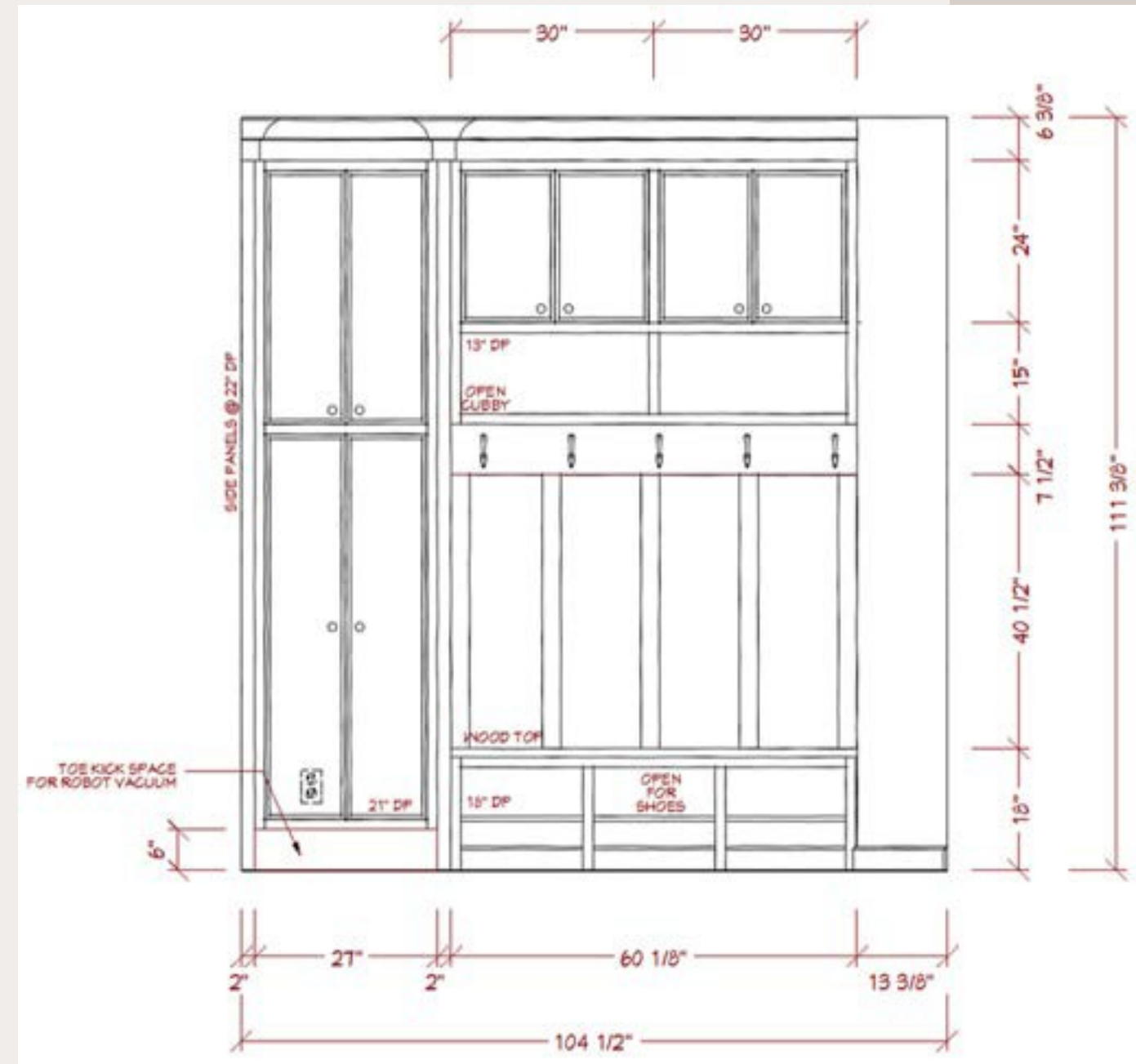
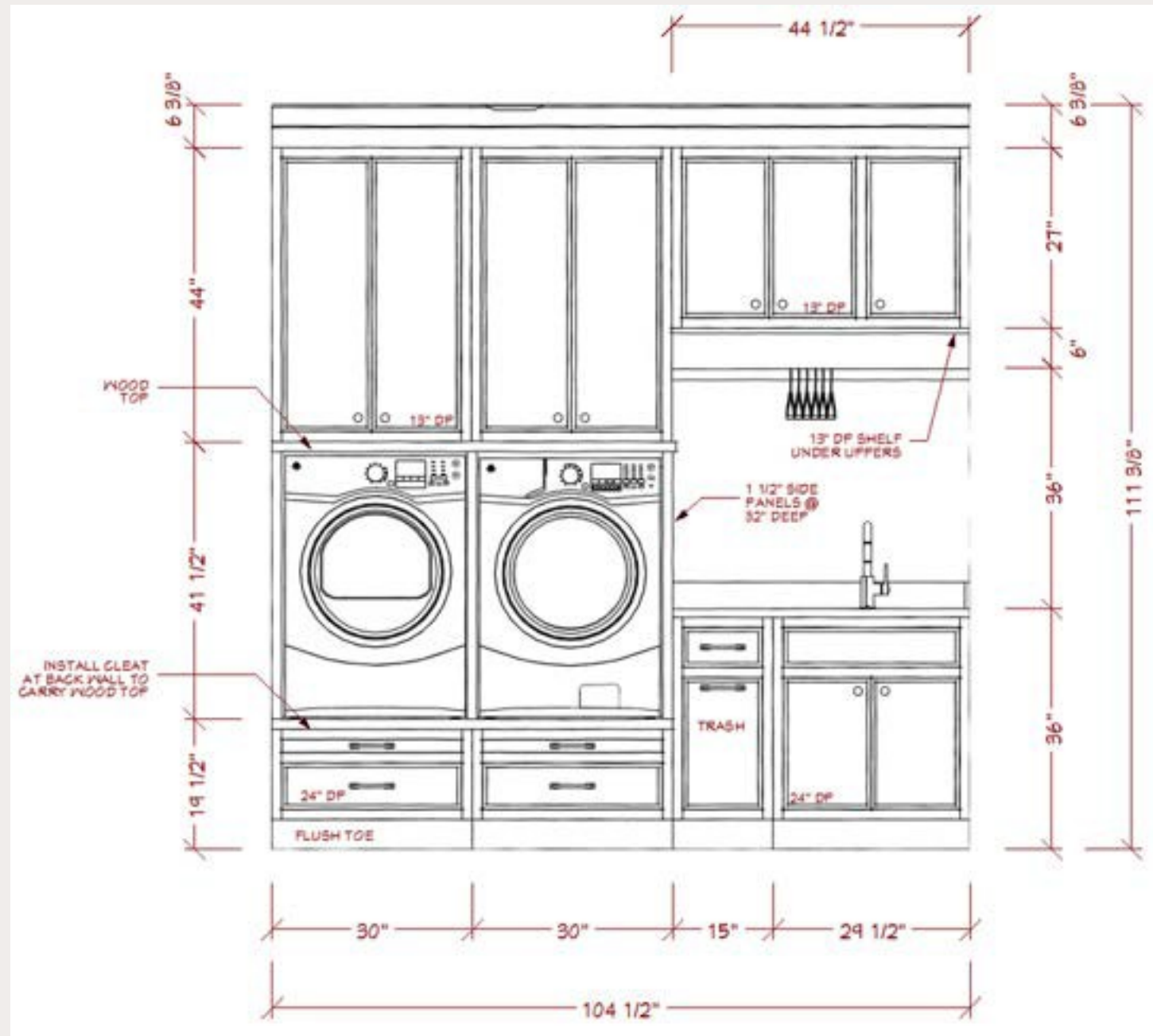


Old Laundry Room

A reconfigured laundry area now features roll- out shelves beneath the washer and dryer for transferring wash loads. The cubbies provide the necessary closed storage needed as an extension of the mud room, and now there's a convenient place for the robot vacuum (under the tall cabinet).
