

Only eligible households may enroll.

What Is the Emergency Broadband Benefit?

EBB is a temporary benefit program from the Federal Government designed to help low-income households connect to the Internet during the COVID-19 crisis. Qualified households can receive a temporary monthly credit of up to \$50/month (up to \$75/month for customers in Tribal Lands) for their Internet bill, until the funding runs out.

Am I Eligible for this Benefit?

If you're an Internet Essentials customer, you automatically qualify for EBB and simply need to enroll in the program. Other qualifying criteria include the Lifeline program, Medicaid, SNAP, free and reduced-price school lunch program, Pell Grant, or a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020.

How to Apply for this Benefit

Current Internet Essentials customers automatically qualify and can skip to step 3.

Once you have successfully enrolled, you will see the Emergency Broadband Benefit credit on your bill toward your Internet service. Note: This credit may not appear on the first bill and instead you will receive two credits on your second bill. Once the EBB program ends, your service will continue at regular rates. You can choose to change your Internet service by visiting Xfinity.com/MyAccount, or cancel your Internet service by calling 1-800-Xfinity.

Internet Essentials Partnership Program

The Internet Essentials Partnership Program (IEPP) is designed to help accelerate Internet adoption at a critical time. This program provides the opportunity for school districts and other organizations to fund and quickly connect students and families to broadband access at home.

Partners, such as schools, healthcare providers, and other community-based organizations, can sponsor, Internet Essentials service for their eligible members/families. The minimum requirements to establish a Partnership Program Agreement are at least a six-month term for at least 25 eligible applicants that are new to the program.

IEPP Partners may select between one of two speed-tier options of service.

Internet Essentials:

- 50/5 Mbps
- \$9.95/month + tax
- No equipment rental fees

Internet Essentials Plus (begins in Aug):

- 100/5 Mbps
- \$29.95/month + tax
- Equipment rental fees included

Emergency Connectivity Fund

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The Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF) is a \$7.17 billion fund to support remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic by funding efforts by schools and libraries to provide broadband and connected devices for use away from school. The focus of ECF is on unconnected students and is not limited based on household income. ECF is limited to nonprofit schools and libraries eligible for E-Rate.

A second filing window is opening on September 28 and closes on October 13, for the purchase of eligible equipment and services between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022


