How to Arrive... and Thrive at NATOA's Conference

Check out these useful TIPS and TRICKS

- ⇒ There are usually multiple sessions and/or events going on at the same time. TRICK: Prioritize the educational and networking events you need to attend to meet your goals, but also branch out and learn new things.
- ⇒ The name badge that you receive at registration is your ticket to sessions, receptions and the exhibit hall so it's important that you wear it at all conference -related events. TIP: Pick-up your first-timer ribbon at registration and wear it with pride! It's a great way to start a conversation with other attendees.
- ⇒ Be on time (early if possible). TRICK: Our keynote lunches are typically FULL HOUSES so get there early to grab a seat of your choice with a colleague or friend. Introduce yourself to the table and discuss sessions. The most important takeaways from the conference are the relationships you develop!
- ⇒ Session Q&A: Feel free to ask questions but it's important to note that media and the companies you have questions about may be in the room. TIP: Sensitive questions should be handled at the end of the session, on breaks, lunch, and always in a professional manner.
- ⇒ Visit the exhibitors and have them sign your passport that you pick-up at registration. Our exhibitors are an important part of the conference. TIP: Turn in your completed passport by lunch on Wednesday for a drawing for some great prizes including a free 2023 conference registration!
- ⇒ After the event, complete the post-conference evaluation and let us know how your experience was we love input from our first timers!
