A BILL

To require Senate confirmation of Inspector General of the
Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection, and for other
purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Bureau of Consumer
5 Financial Protection-Inspector General Reform Act of
6 2013”, or the “CFPB-IG Act of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. APPOINTMENT OF INSPECTOR GENERAL.**

2 The Inspector General Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.)
3 is amended—

4 (1) in section 8G—

5 (A) in subsection (a)(2), by striking “and
6 the Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection”;

7 (B) in subsection (c), by striking “For the
8 purposes of implementing this section” and all
9 that follows through the end of the subsection;
10 and

11 (C) in subsection (g)(3), by striking “and
12 the Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection”;
13 and

14 (2) in section 12—

15 (A) in paragraph (1), by inserting “the Di-
16 rector of the Bureau of Consumer Financial
17 Protection;” after “the President of the Import-
18 Export Bank;”; and

19 (B) in paragraph (2), by inserting “the
20 Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection,”
21 after “the Import-Export Bank,”.
