


















Small Businesses Lead Jobs Creation

- Net job creation rate is notably higher for younger firms (red lines) than for older ones (blue lines).
- Net job creation rate hovers around 15% to 20% for younger firms; is 0% or negative for older firms.
- One NC Small Business
 Program is the only program
 within the NC Department of
 Commerce that <u>focuses
 exclusively on young,
 innovative small businesses.

Note: Older firms = 6 years and up; younger = 5 years and under.

To Grow Jobs, Federal Government (in 1980s & 90s) Created:

America's Seed Fund

Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR)



U.S. Small Business Administration

<u>Highly competitive</u> programs run through 11 federal agencies (e.g., DoD, NIH, NSF) that fund businesses to engage in Research and Development (R&D) with strong potential for commercialization, growth, and job creation "We in government must work in partnership with small businesses to ensure that technologies and processes are readily transferred to commercial applications."

SBIR & STTR Use a Three-Phase, Stage-Gate Process

Phase I Concept Development 6 months – 1 year ~ \$50,000 – \$300,000

Phase II

Prototype Development 24 months ~ \$500,000 – \$2.1M Phase III Commercialization Not SBIR/STTR funding

In 2022*, ~\$4.7 billion awarded nationally via more than 6,000 / awards to ~3,700 awardees; 81% via Phase II awards.

Yet, federal Phase I grants are often not enough to enable innovators to succeed and proceed to Phase II one north carolina Small Business Program NCGS § 143B-437.80-81

Authorized by General Assembly in 2005 to <u>target Phase I, increase success,</u> and ultimately win more Phase II dollars Thank vou!!!

Two Programs Under the One NC Small Business Program

Incentive: reimburses (up to \$12k) companies for cost of preparing Phase I SBIR/STTR proposals.

- 1. <u>Incentivizes NC companies to compete</u> for Phase I SBIR/STTR funds.
- 2. <u>Increases number & quality of NC applications</u> for Phase I SBIR/STTR funds.


Matching: awards grant (up to \$200k) to companies who have <u>received a Phase I SBIR/STTR award</u>.

- 1. <u>Makes NC companies more competitive</u> for Phase II SBIR/STTR funds.
- 2. <u>Helps NC companies bridge funding gap</u> between Phase I and Phase II funds.

Plays a Critical Role in Our State's Innovation Pipeline:




Grants Have Been Awarded throughout NC, FY 2006-2024

Grants Have Led to Significant Employee and Wage Growth





Your support has helped add jobs and increase wages across the state.

State funding leverages larger follow-on funding amounts from multiple other sources.








