This past year was also a highly successful year for the Society's award-winning Integrated Casting Order Network (ICON) program. During 2022, NFFS worked with the Department of Defense and the Defense Logistics Agency to secure continued funding for ICON. We all should be proud of this program and those who contribute to its success.

Another significant accomplishment of 2022 was the launch of the Society's new Air Sampling Equipment Program, which provides members with free access to sampling equipment and discounted lab services, helping them comply with important OSHA regulations. This type of program is at the heart of what NFFS strives to accomplish.

Also in 2022, we completed an overhaul to the technology that runs the back end of the Society's operations. The most noticeable change is the new NFFS website and our new weekly newsletter, *The Crucible*, which provides our members and subscribers with even more timely and relevant content.

I would like to thank the NFFS staff, Executive Committee, Board, and membership for their support over the last two years. Highlights of 2022

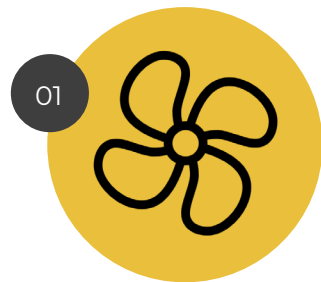
At NFFS, we work hard to deliver demonstrable value to our members and the industry at large. Here are a few examples of your membership investment at work.

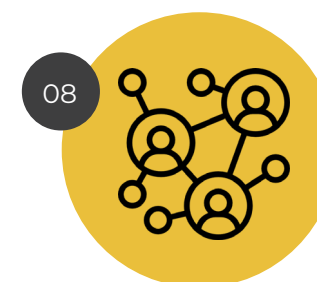
Profitability Webinar

FY22 Operating Revenue Highlights

- Dues income exceeded budget for the 3rd consecutive year.
- Non-dues revenues nearly doubled 2021 levels due to increased participation in the Society's Grainger and shipping programs.
- Total revenues increased 5.1% over 2021 levels despite cancellation of the 2022 NFFS Industry Executive Conference.

FY22 Operating Expense Highlights

- NFFS invested nearly \$16,000 for new internal management software, including a new user-friendly website and a planned expansion to its member communications.
- No travel expenses were incurred due to the cancellation of the 2022 NFFS conference.

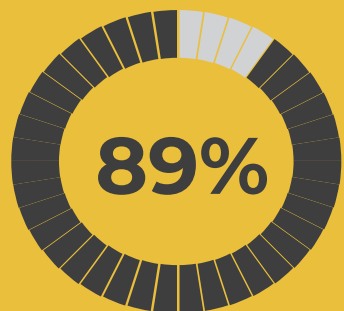

Automation & Robotics



36% of member foundries reported that they **currently use some form of robotics or automation** in their foundries. 61% do not use automation/robotics, and 2% were unsure.



52% of member foundries reported that they **plan to invest in new robotics or automation** in the next three years. 7% do not plan to invest in automation, and 41% were unsure.

Supply Chain



70% of member foundries reported that **supply chain difficulties had a negative effect on their businesses**. **21%** said they did not have a negative effect, and **9%** were unsure.

Inflation



60% of member foundries reported that **inflation had a negative effect on their businesses**. **19%** said inflation did not have a negative effect, and **21%** were unsure.

New Member Programs in 2022

At NFFS, we are always looking to create value and address the emerging needs of our members. Using input from the 2022 Member Survey, the Society launched two new member programs:

- ▶ The **Air Sampling Equipment Program**, which opened to members in July, offers free use of air sampling equipment, which can be costly to purchase or rent and difficult to maintain. Members also receive sampling

media at cost and discounted lab services from Analytics Corporation.

- ▶ Formed in June 2022, the **Foundry Automation, Integration and Robotics (FAIR) Working Group** is charged with investigating available automation solutions for foundries and determining how those solutions can be rapidly deployed within the non-ferrous foundry industry.

Government Affairs

The NFFS Government Affairs Committee identifies issues with the potential to affect our industry and works proactively to defend the concerns and interests of the non-ferrous metalcasting industry.

NFFS Urges Passage of Miscellaneous Tariff Bill

On March 9th, NFFS once again called on Congress to pass the Miscellaneous Tariff Bill, which expired in December 2020. The MTB corrects historical distortions in the U.S. tariff code by eliminating border tariffs on imported products for which there is no, or insufficient, domestic production and availability.

NFFS Supports Strong U.S. Supply Chains

NFFS joined the National Association of Manufacturers and other manufacturing and business organizations in supporting the Manufacturing Security and Resiliency Program, which would provide grants, loans, and loan guarantees to support efforts to improve and strengthen critical supply chains and ensure the production of critical goods.

NFFS Fights R&D Expense Amortization Provisions

NFFS joined a broad alliance of industry groups and associations fighting to repeal the R&D expense amortization provision found in the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. This provision requires companies to begin amortizing their R&D investments over five years instead of expensing them in the same year they incur the costs.

NFFS Opposes Tax Hikes on Manufacturers

On August 3rd, NFFS joined the National Association of Manufacturers in opposing the inclusion of a tax on the financial statement income of certain businesses as part of the "Inflation Reduction Act." The nonpartisan Joint Committee on Taxation found that nearly 50% of the burden of this tax would fall on manufacturers.

ICON Program



In the last five years, ICON users were awarded more than **15,693 contracts** worth more than **\$337 million**.

Supporting our Military, Supporting Foundries

The ICON program is a web-based portal and resource created to simplify the government procurement process for cast parts and drive business to American foundries and machine shops. Since its inception, ICON has generated thousands of new business orders for the cast metals industry. In 2022:

- ▶ ICON directed 7,937 government solicitations to ICON users; of that, 2,948 contracts were awarded to ICON users.
- ▶ ICON reached record participation levels with a total of 1,179 users, including 764 foundry users, 357 suppliers, and 58 machine shops.
- ▶ Over 164,000 components and catalog items are listed and available for purchase in the program's Inventory Management module.

Facilitating Government Partnerships

The ICON team at NFFS participated in a variety of events throughout the year to help build relationships, facilitate effective partnerships between industry and government, and introduce potential new users to the benefits of the ICON program.
