

2025 NEW YORK HOUSING ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Requirements and Information (Accredited Trade or Technical Schools/Programs, College or University)

Scholarship applicants <u>MUST</u> be associated with the manufactured or modular housing construction industry to be considered. For example, if the student/individual currently lives in a manufactured or modular home; or if the student/individual <u>has a close relative who works in the manufactured housing industry</u> (i.e., father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, aunt or uncle); or the student/individual is currently working in the industry via one of the intern/apprenticeship programs; or is directly employed by a manufactured or modular housing construction-related company.

- 1. In order for a student to be eligible to receive one of the state financial awards from the New York Housing Association Scholarship fund, the following criteria must be followed:
 - Must have graduated from a New York High School (private, public, parochial) or equivalent (GED).
 - Must be accepted by an accredited New York Trade or Technical School/Program or other institute of higher learning.
 - The institute of higher learning must <u>be an accredited New York State</u> public or private university or college, a junior college or an accredited trade or technical school/program.
- 2. Students must be pursuing a career in a skilled trades and labor field which supports the construction industry or a degree field which supports the construction industry. See example list on page 2 of this notice.
 - a. **The Scholarship** is a one-time award, in the amount of \$1,000 for up to one (1) student/individual in each of the four (4) regions defined in Appendix A; and
 - Tuition is paid directly to the educational facility, as long as the below criteria is met:
 - Must be enrolled in an accredited New York Trade or Technical School and/or is a full-time student at an institute of higher learning, as defined by the accredited facility or institute of choice.
 - <u>Students</u> must notify their accredited facility or institute of higher learning the New York
 Housing Association requires official verification that the student is enrolled in the upcoming
 semester or program. This shall be completed in order for scholarship funds to be disbursed
 on the student's behalf.
 - If the New York Housing Association does not receive an enrollment verification from the accredited facility or institute of choice, a forfeiture of funds may occur.
 - It is the Student's responsibility to coordinate a statement of enrollment via the accredited facility or institute of choice, and follow up with the institutes assigned coordinator, to ensure compliance has been completed.
