

Tips for the Legislative Reception

Every other year, the OTA Winter Conference features a legislative reception, giving OTA members the opportunity to connect directly with legislators at the Ohio Statehouse. **This year's reception will be held on Wednesday, February 4**, in the Statehouse Crypt/Museum Gallery, offering township officials a valuable chance to engage with their legislators and staff. Historically, the OTA's Legislative Reception has been the event to attend - legislators look forward to meeting with their townships and hearing the stories of the communities they serve.

For those who have never attended the OTA's Legislative Reception or for anyone who could use a refresher, below are a few tips to help you make the most of the evening.

The 136th General Assembly has seen no shortage of legislative activity. With the state operating budget complete and numerous bills moving through the legislative process, there is plenty to discuss. If you already have strong relationships with your House and Senate members, that's excellent, but the reception is still an ideal time to reconnect.

If you don't have an established relationship with your legislators, this is the perfect opportunity to start one. The reception offers a comfortable setting to introduce yourself and briefly discuss issues important to your township. While the OTA has sent formal invitations to legislators, we strongly encourage you to personally invite them, as well. A constituent invitation carries the greatest weight. Contact their legislative offices by phone or email and invite them to join you and other township officials in the Museum Gallery from 4:30 - 6:00 p.m. on February 4th. Legislators prioritize events where constituents are present, and letting their office know you will be in Columbus gives them even more reason to attend. Their contact information is available at legislature.ohio.gov.

When it comes to the winter conference dress code, there is not one as the conference is informal, but the Legislative Reception is not. **Business attire is required** when attending the reception at the Ohio Statehouse. As a general guideline, wear something that you would feel comfortable wearing to church or an evening wedding. While we want you to feel at ease while networking, presenting yourself professionally is essential. As a reminder, you will have to go through security so please do not have weapons with you.

While at the reception, please address legislators respectfully, using their proper titles - Senator or Representative - unless they tell you otherwise.

The OTA will provide transportation to and from the Statehouse. When you arrive, feel free to grab food and beverages before legislators arrive. This helps avoid the inevitable awkward moment of trying to discuss policy with a mouth full of hors d'oeuvres.

Once you return home, be sure to send a thank you note to the legislators you met with. Follow up on any information you offered to provide, and consider inviting them to visit your township for a meeting or event. Remember, House and Senate members will be campaigning in 2026, making this an especially timely moment to strengthen those relationships.

OTA staff will be in attendance throughout the event to help guide attendees and assist legislators in finding you. **Your engagement, however, is what makes this event successful.** With your participation, we can make the 2026 OTA Legislative Reception the best one yet!
