What is the deadline to get special room rates?

The hotel reservation cut off date is January 9, 2026. After this date, availability may be limited and room rates are subject to change.

What if I need to change or cancel my reservation?

Changes and cancellations prior to February 3, 2026, can be made using the online reservation system or emailed to the Housing Bureau at *Housing@ExperienceColumbus.com*. To cancel your reservation after February 3, 2026, contact your hotel directly. You may be charged a fee. "No shows" will be billed for one room night.

#### **CONFERENCE APP**
