Planning During Retirement Course Description:

This program will cover the essentials of employer retirement plans. We'll cover IRA distributions, conversions, and rollovers, and how this will interplay with Social Security benefits. We will review SECURE ACT 2.0 changes to required minimum distributions and Inherited IRAs. We will discuss alternative advanced distribution approaches under 72(t) Substantially Equal Periodic Payments ("SEPP") and Net unrealized Appreciation ("NUA"). We'll examine strategies to avoid traps in the IRA area including prohibited transactions, excess contributions, and impermissible investments.
