



















Reopenings, renovations, new arrivals — in downtown St. Paul



The new owner of the James J. Hill Center's historic building in downtown St. Paul said Thursday that he plans to make "significant" improvements to the shuttered venue and reuse it as an arts and cultural

Developer Peter Remes of Minneapolis-based First & First said the 43,776-square-foot building will host performances, parties, weddings, corporate events, book launches and other events after the improvements are completed.

"I always thought it was a beautiful building in the community," said Remes, who purchased the building this week.
