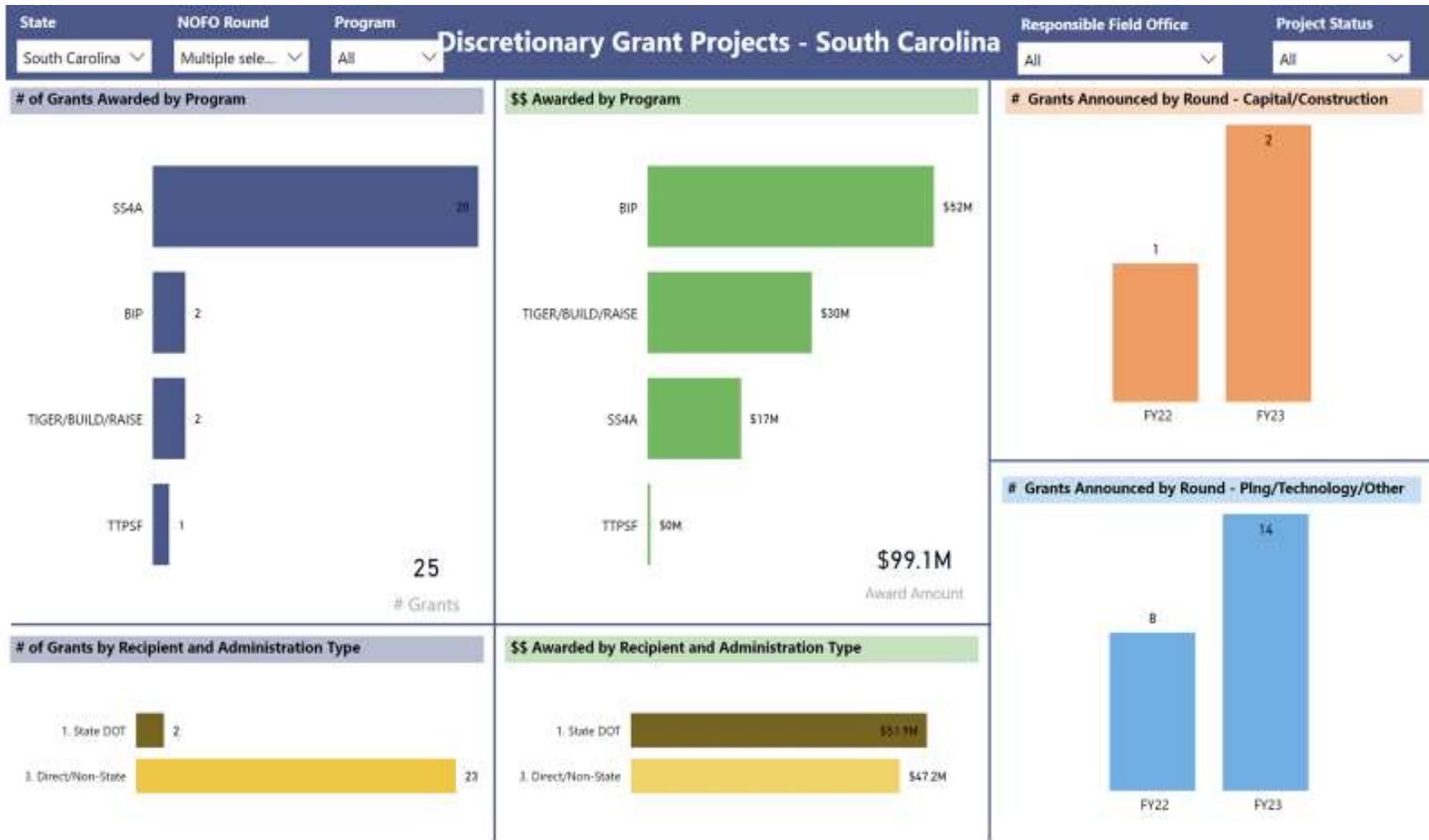

# Build America, Buy America Act

- Office of Management and Budget (OMB) issued final guidance on August 23, 2023, for implementation of the Build America, Buy America Act (BABA) provisions of the IIJA

- The effective date is October 23, 2023.



## IIJA Funding – DOT/OIG Fraud Awareness

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) includes a 5-year reauthorization (FY22-26) of surface transportation programs and a direct advanced appropriations 5-year package valued at over \$660 billion.

- Bridge Formula Program: \$28 billion (5 years)
- Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grants \$2.5 billion
- Charging Formula Program \$5 billion
- Bridge Investment Program: \$16 billion
- National infrastructure Investments: \$15 billion
- Significant Freight & Highway Projects: 14 billion
