NEW - DEBRIS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The City of San Diego's Environmental Services Department is helping to make **construction and demolition debris removal** safer, easier and faster for residents and businesses recovering from the recent storm. See reverse side of this flyer for details.

LARGE ROLL-OFF BINS FOR WASTE DISPOSAL

The City of San Diego has placed dumpsters that are **large roll-off bins** to storm-impacted areas in Southcrest, Encanto, Mountain View and Lincoln Park. These bins are for neighbors to share and to be used for the proper disposal of **waste and debris generated as a result of the storm**. Please do not place Household Hazardous Waste* in or around the dumpsters or roll-off bins or anywhere on the street. City staff are proactively monitoring these bins regularly and will have the contractor replace them as they reach capacity.

Please call **858-694-7000** for assistance with disposing of electronic waste (i.e. televisions, computers), tires, or appliances (i.e. dishwashers, refrigerators, dryers).

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

*Household Hazardous Waste includes but is not limited to aerosols, latex/oil paints, antifreeze, lightbulbs, batteries (rechargeable and single use), pesticides, auto fluids, pool chemicals, propane tanks (less than 30 gallons), disinfectants, solvents, fertilizer, used oil and oil filters, medications (not including controlled substances) and contaminated sharp objects such as needles or syringes.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is not allowed in any dumpster or roll-off bin. If you are located in a flood-impacted area and are unable to transport **Household Hazardous Waste* (HHW)** to the City's Hazardous Waste Transfer Facility, we will make arrangements for the City's hazardous waste contractor to remove the HHW directly from your home. Call **858-694-7000** or use the Get It Done app to schedule a drop-off appointment with the Household Hazardous Waste Transfer Facility or to schedule a door-to-door service, if needed.

REPLACEMENT OF BLACK, BLUE AND GREEN BINS

Now through Feb. 23, the City's Environmental Services Department (ESD) will be going door to door in affected areas to assess the need to **replace black**, **blue and green bins** that were either lost or damaged because of the storm. When deemed appropriate, new trash, recycling, and organic **waste bins will be provided at no cost**. Residents can also request replacements by calling **858-694-7000** or reporting it at **sandiego.gov/get-it-done**.

IN-PERSON ASSISTANCE FOR ALL STORM-RELATED ISSUES

In-person **assistance for storm-related issues** is available at the Mountain View/Beckwourth Library at 721 San Pasqual St. Internet access and digital devices are on-site.

Debris Assistance Program

Have you been affected by the recent storms in San Diego and need a container to help with debris disposal? The City of San Diego is here to help.

The City of San Diego Environmental Services Department (ESD) is helping to make construction and demolition debris removal safer, easier and faster for residents and businesses recovering from the recent storm. Through the new Debris Assistance Program (DAP), containers can be ordered and used for recycling and/or disposal of trash and construction and demolition waste from the impacted property.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

Please check if there's already a City-provided large roll-off container on your street for you and your neighbors to share. If a container is not there, call ESD (858-694-7000) or email DAP@sandiego.gov to request service.	An ESD representative will work with you to provide the right container size and pick-up frequency to suit your needs and schedule your container delivery.	The container will be delivered onto your property or street for trash or construction and demolition recycling.	If you require additional pick-ups or notice your container is full, please contact the ESD Contact Center via phone (858-694-7000) or DAP@sandiego.gov.	Once your storm debris removal is complete, please call the ESD Contact Center (858-694-7000) or email DAP@ sandiego.gov to schedule your final pick-up and removal of the container from your property.

WHAT CONTAINERS ARE BEING OFFERED?

We offer two types of containers. Below are approximate sizes for each one:

DUMPSTERS	3 cubic yard – Dimensions: 6'2" L x 4' W x 4'6" H 4 cubic yard – Dimensions: 6'2" L x 5' W x 5' H
ROLLOFFS	10 cubic yard – Dimensions: 16'6" L x 8' W x 2' H 20 cubic yard – Dimensions: 14'6" L x 8' W x 7' H 40 cubic yard – Dimensions: 22' L x 8' W x 7' H

HOW WILL I KNOW IF I'M ELIGIBLE?

If your property was flooded and is located in one of these affected communities, you are eligible to apply for the Debris Assistance Program: Mountain View, Encanto, Southcrest, Mount Hope, Shelltown, Southcrest, Rolando and San Ysidro. If you are unsure, please call the **ESD Customer Contact Center at 858-694-7000** or email **DAP@sandiego.gov** and a representative will be able to assist you.

WHAT IF I NEED ASSISTANCE MOVING DEBRIS?
