

- 1. Each set will consist of three (3) games (best two of three games) to seven (7) points (the winning team must be ahead by a two point margin to win).
- 2. There will be a fifteen (15) minute time limit per match. If the teams are tied when the time expires, there will be a one (1) minute rest. A coin toss will determine the first team to serve, with each team serving at least once. If the times runs out during the 3<sup>rd</sup> game, the team that is ahead will be granted the win.
- 3. On the second game, the team that did not start serving will serve first and sides will be switched.
- 4. Teams will switch sides at point four (4) of the third game.
- 5. Only Team Captains may dispute a call to the referee.
- 6. No obvious carries, i.e. no underhand hitting of the ball or use of the fist.
- 7. Three (3) hits per side. Recovery off block does not count as a hit. Overhand or underhand serves. Absolutely no touching of nets by players.
- 8. Serving must be done beyond end line. Ball cannot hit the net on serve. 2 on 2 beach volleyball it counts, not 6 on 6.
- 9. Player can cross center line as long as there is no interference of play. Exception: Server cannot break center line.
- 10. The game balls will be AVP's by Spalding or equivalent.
- 11. Each player is responsible for being aware of boundary lines, safety zones and out of play calls. You must let the ball hit the ground if you think it is out of play.
- 12. Each team will be allowed two (2) thirty (30) second time outs (included in the time limit). Substitutions may only be made during a dead ball.
- 13. We will use USVBA rules with modifications as specified in the following: Referees will call each game based on the caliber of teams playing. It is strongly advised that all players wear protective footwear.
- 14. The championship game (and possibly the semifinals) will have two (2) net referees along with two (2) line judges.
- 15. Each team must have always at least two (2) female players on the court during play or they will forfeit the match. If a company (supplier or management) has multiple teams, they may switch out their players at any time as long as there are 6 players on the court and 2 are female.
- 16. It is the responsibility of the winning team's captain to report their score to the Tournament Coordinator at the scoring tent.
- 17. Each team captain is responsible for knowing what court their next game is on. The team will have 3 minutes to report to the designated court when called or will be disqualified. If unsure, please check with the Tournament Coordinator at the scoring tent.

- 18. If a company has two teams in the tournament, they can swap out players if needed due to injury, work, or family commitments.
- 19. Teams can be made of multiple management or multiple suppliers such as if a supplier has only 3 people that want to play the game. They can team up with another supplier to play with at least 6 people.
