WHO IS SHLB?

The Schools, Health & Libraries Broadband Coalition (SHLB) is the **leading national public interest organization** promoting low-cost, high-capacity Internet access for anchor institutions and their surrounding communities. Schools, libraries, telehealth providers and other anchor institutions play a vital role in eliminating the digital divide and solving the homework gap. SHLB's advocacy ensures that anchor institutions' unique needs and contributions are recognized and included in federal, state and local broadband programs.

Based in Washington DC, SHLB ("Shell-bee") works closely with Congress, federal agencies (like NTIA and the FCC), and state and local governments to promote its <u>mission</u>. We publish research and blogs, develop recommendations (with input from our members) on key <u>policy issues</u>, and meet with policymakers to promote our ideas. SHLB focuses on those broadband issues that are essential to bring affordable Internet access to all, such as E-rate, rural telehealth, wireless broadband, digital equity, broadband infrastructure, pole attachments, and Universal Service Fund reform.

Founded in 2009, SHLB was initially supported by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and now is funded principally from membership dues. SHLB's membership includes hundreds of <u>organizations</u> from across the broadband ecosystem. Any organization that supports our mission can join.
