
Arizona2024 State Abortion Care Policies



Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- Abortion care is banned at 15 weeks, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's health or life
- **24-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- Mandatory ultrasound before abortion care can be provided
- State Medicaid coverage of abortion care is banned except in limited circumstances
- Parental consent is required for minors







Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

Legislative: Use our <u>interactive map</u> to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

Ballot Measure: On Election Day in November, Arizona voters will decide on the <u>Arizona Abortion Access Act</u>, or <u>Proposition 131</u>, which would establish constitutional protections for abortion care up until fetal viability as determined on a case by cases basis by clinicians, with exceptions for the life of the pregnant person.
