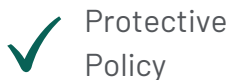


Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- ✗ **Abortion care is banned at 6 weeks and later**, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or prevent serious risk to health, if the fetus will not survive the pregnancy, and in cases of rape or incest
- ✗ **24-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- ✗ **Mandatory ultrasound** before abortion care can be provided
- ✗ **State Medicaid coverage of abortion care is banned** except in limited circumstances
- ✗ **Parental consent** is required for minors
