
Florida 2024 State Abortion Care Policies




Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- Abortion care is banned at 6 weeks and later, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or prevent serious risk to health, if the fetus will not survive the pregnancy, and in cases of rape or incest
- **24-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- Mandatory ultrasound before abortion care can be provided
- X State Medicaid coverage of abortion care is banned except in limited circumstances
- **Parental consent** is required for minors







Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

Legislative: Use our <u>interactive map</u> to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

Ballot Measure: On Election Day in November, Florida voters will decide on Amendment 4, which would provide constitutional protections for abortion care up until fetal viability as determined on a case by cases basis by clinicians.
