

### Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care\*

- ✗ **Abortion care is completely banned**, with affirmative defenses for the pregnant person's health and life
- ✗ **72-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- ✗ **Mandatory ultrasound** before abortion care can be provided
- ✗ **State Medicaid and private insurance coverage of abortion care is banned** except in limited circumstances
- ✗ **Parental consent** is required for minors

### Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

**Legislative:** Use our [interactive map](#) to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

**Ballot Measure:** On Election Day in November, Missouri voters will decide on the [Right to Reproductive Freedom amendment, or Amendment 3](#), which would provide constitutional protections for reproductive health care, including abortion care up until fetal viability, except when to save the life, physical, or mental health of the pregnant patient.
