
Nebraska 2024 State Abortion Care Policies




Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- Abortion care is banned at 12 weeks and later, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or health and in cases of rape or incest
- **24-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- State Medicaid and private insurance coverage of abortion care is banned except in limited circumstances
- Parental consent is required for minors







Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

Legislative: Use our <u>interactive map</u> to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

Ballot Measure: On Election Day in November, Nebraska voters will decide two ballot measures:

- The <u>Protect the Right to Abortion initiative</u> would establish protections for abortion care up until fetal viability as determined by clinicians, with exceptions for the life or health of the pregnant person.
- The <u>Protect Women and Children initiative</u> would ban abortion care in the second and third trimesters, with exceptions for medical emergencies, rape, or incest.
