
Nevada 2024 State Abortion Care Policies




Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- **Abortion care is banned at 24 weeks,** with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or health (including mental health)
- √ No waiting period or mandated counseling
- A **shield law** protects abortion care providers from investigations by other states; may cover patients and support organizations
- State Medicaid coverage of abortion care is banned except in limited cases. However, a 2024 district court struck it down. The case is being appealed
- √ No parental notice requirement







Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

Legislative: Use our <u>interactive map</u> to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

Ballot Measure: On Election Day in November, Nevada voters will decide on the <u>Nevada Right to Reproductive Freedom Act</u> which would establish the right to an abortion care until viability, except where medically indicated to protect the life, physical health, or mental health of the pregnant individual.
