

Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care*

- ✗ **Abortion care is banned at 12 weeks and later**, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or health and in cases of rape or incest
- ✗ **24-hour waiting period** between mandatory in-person counseling and abortion care
- ✗ **State Medicaid and private insurance coverage of abortion care are banned** except in limited circumstances
- ✗ **Parental consent** is required for minors

Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

Ballot Measure: On Election Day in November, Nebraska voters will decide on the [Choose Life Now](#) constitutional amendment that would establish fetal personhood, effectively banning all abortion care. This comes two years after voters approved a constitutional amendment banning abortion care after the first trimester.
