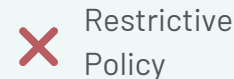
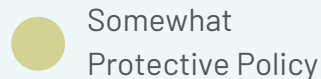


### Key Policies Impacting Access to Abortion Care\*

- **Abortion care is banned at 24 weeks**, with exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or health (including mental health)
- ✓ **No waiting period or mandated counseling**
- ✓ **A shield law** protects abortion care providers from investigations by other states; may cover patients and support organizations
- ✓ **State Medicaid covers abortion care**
- ✓ **No parental notice requirement**



### Current Efforts to Change Access to Abortion Care

**Legislative:** Use our [interactive map](#) to see what policies have been introduced in the state legislature that would impact access to abortion care.

**Ballot Measure:** On Election Day in November, Nevada voters will decide on the [Nevada Right to Reproductive Freedom Act](#) which would establish the right to abortion care until "fetal viability," except where medically indicated to protect the life, physical health, or mental health of the pregnant individual. This measure was approved by voters in November 2024. In Nevada, constitutional amendments must pass two consecutive cycles.
