Our members see the sickest patients with the most complicated pregnancies. SMFM supports the clinical practice of maternal-fetal medicine by providing education, promoting research, and engaging in advocacy to optimize the health of high-risk pregnant women and their babies.

Our members are on the front lines of the COVID-19 epidemic and are first-hand witnesses to the health inequities in our country. Not only are Black women three times more likely to die from a pregnancy-related complication than white women in the U.S., but early data indicates that the Black community is particularly hard hit by COVID-19, as well. We have urged the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to collect data stratified by race and ethnicity so that researchers and health care clinicians can understand the risk and ensure appropriate treatment, and are now asking that industry work to address these health inequities, as well.
