Introducing the Rorschach Comprehensive System-Revised (CS-R): Theory & Practice (Two-Day Workshop)

Description: Rorschach Workshops in conjunction with the International Rorschach Institute have just published the first revision of the CS since 2003 (Exner, Fontan & Andronikof, 2022). The CS-R continues the long tradition of using Exner's CS in an empirically validated fashion, while introducing some new scoring variables and psychometric changes but still allowing for considerable clinical flexibility as well as expansion and future research. The CS-R employs a new computer scoring program (CHESSSS-2), which relies upon validated clinical cut-off scores, but also allows clinicians to compare protocols to national reference samples as well as clinical samples. The CHESSSS-2 program automatically calculates some variables which have been validated since the previous CS version (e.g., Ego Impairment Index-3, Reality Fantasy Scale), but also allows users to enter coding variables that comprise supplementary scales (e.g., Gacano & Smith's Aggressive Content Scores, Weinberger-Katzav & Bornstein's Rorschach Oral Dependency Scale, Cooper, Perry & Arnow's Rorschach Defense Scales). However, such scales are still viewed as supplementary in nature and are not required for CHESSSS-2 Input or CS-R Interpretation.

Materials: Workshop participants are strongly encouraged to purchase CS-R materials from Rorschach Workshops so that they have them at the conference. The registration fee does not include these materials, which may be obtained on the Rorschach Workshops website (rorschachworkshops.com). Once participants are registered for the conference, they will be provided with a code that will enable them to receive a 20% discount for these workbooks.

Who should attend: Psychologists with some experience in administration and scoring of the Rorschach who wish to learn about the psychometric advances, new coding variables, revised and adjusted cut-off scores in the CS-R, and who are interested in using the CS-R in their assessment practice.
