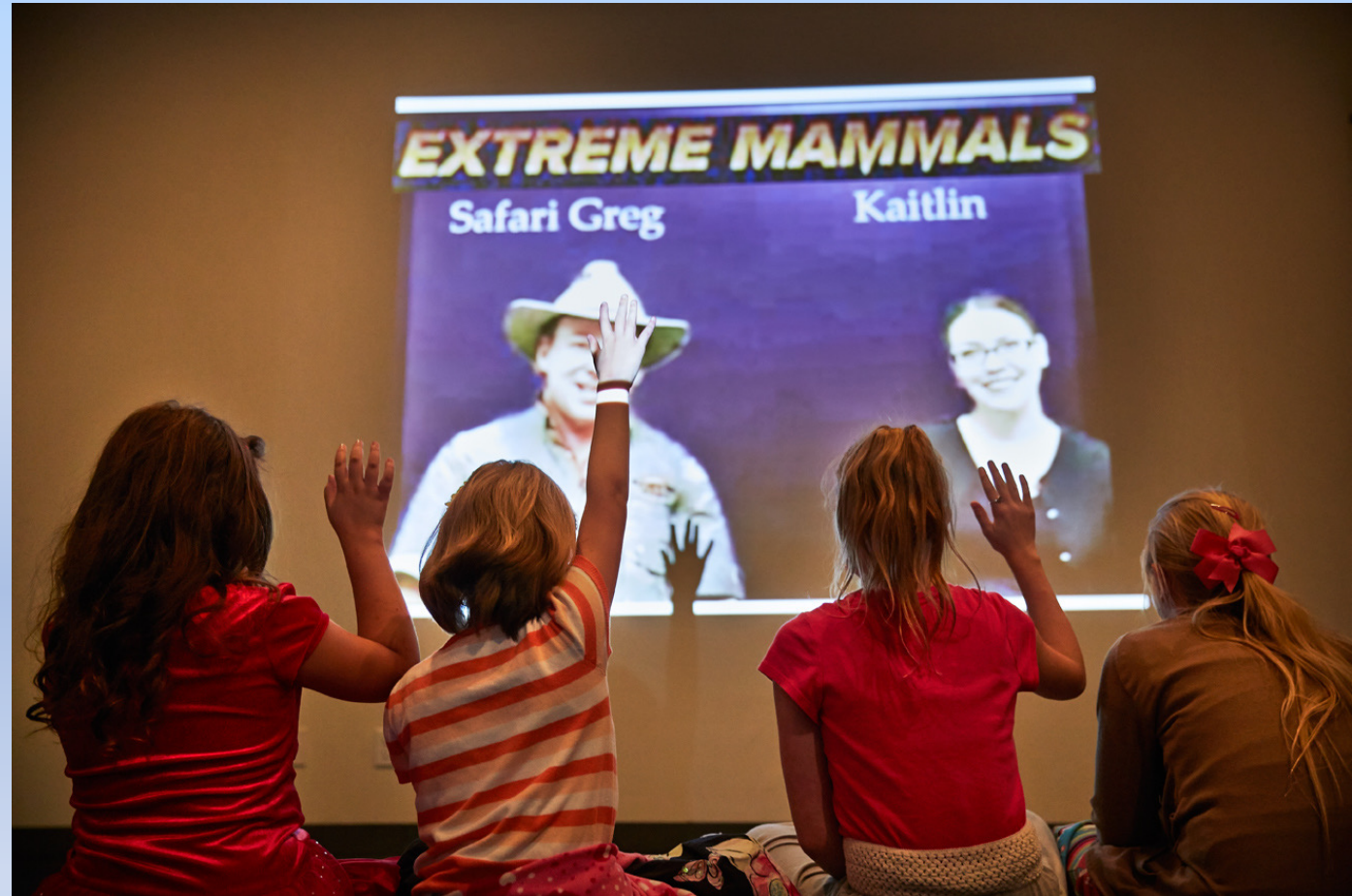

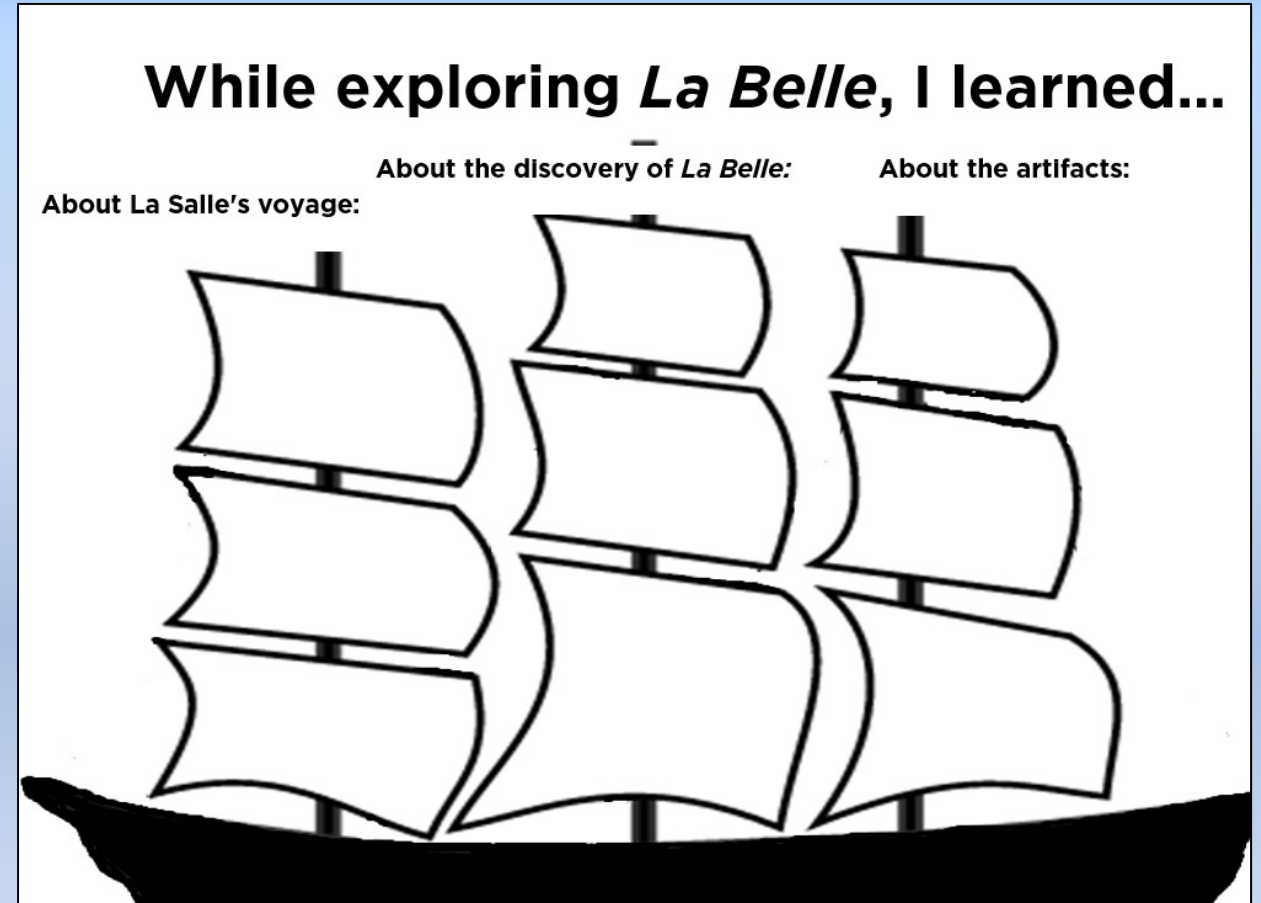

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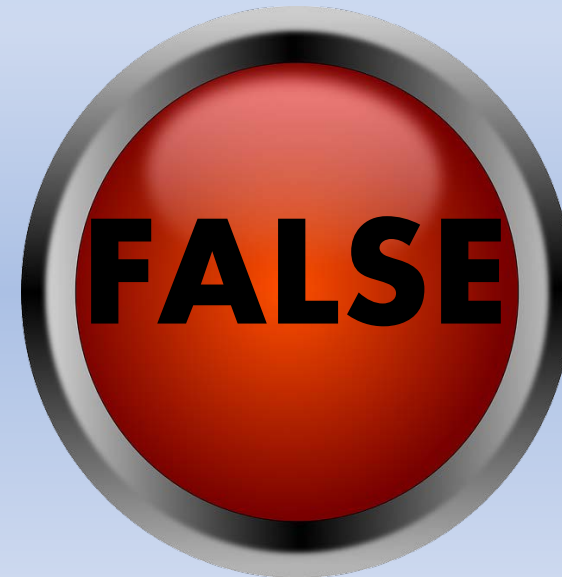

Make It
Materials:

- Air-dry Clay, PlayDough or Model Magic
- Plastic knife
- Toothpick

Instructions:

Step 1- Take a ball of clay and roll it into a rope 1/4" to 1/2" thick



Step 2- Start on one end of the rope, hold and wrap clay rope around itself to create a flat spiral round with a 3-4" diameter.

Ration Add-Up!

Work in groups to “purchase” supplies with ration stamps; each stamp has a point value on it. You need to add up the points to purchase ingredients. You can make changes to the recipe as needed.

- 1 lb of meat = 20 points
- 1 cup of vegetables = 15 points
- 1 cup of flour, sugar or butter = 10 points
- 1 cup broth or milk = 10 points
- ½ cup of oil or any spices = 5 points

- 2 lbs chicken
- 2 stalks of celery
- 4 carrots
- 1 medium onion
- 14 ounces of chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons parsley
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper

- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup milk
