Apple Products: Use 70% isopropyl alcohol wipe or Clorox Wipe

Elo Touchscreens: <70% isopropyl alcohol wipe, Clorox Wipes, or several others

Historic Homes

Sanitization

Painted surfaces, door knobs, handrails: Water and mild soap solution (Ivory Liquid Soap or Orvus WA Paste)

Brick surfaces: Clean with water and mild soap solution then disinfect with isopropyl alcohol Objects on Open Display: Do NOT sanitize. Isolate object with stanchions
