Officer Nominations

Positions slated for elections in 1996 are: Chair, Treasurer and one Officer-at-Large position. The Officer-at-Large position works with Standing Committees for one year and serves as the Editor of the Newsletter in the second year. The bylaws of the CMC outline officer duties as follows:

Article Four

Section Two. The Chair of the Committee is responsible for attending all Annual Business meetings, all Board meetings, and all other meetings of the Committee, as well as the meetings as required by the bylaws fo the TAM. The Chair of the Committee calls all Board meetings and appoints the Chairs of standing committees. A written agenda must be prepared for all business meetings of the Committee and a written annual report must be presented at the Annual Business meeting. The Chair will serve as an ex-officio member of the Board for a period of one year after completion of the term of office. The Collection Managers Committee Chair shall serve no more than two consecutive two year terms.

Section Five. The duties of the Treasurer are to receive dues, to maintain a current membership list, to maintain the checking account for the Committee, to be responsible for all receipts and disbursements, to prepare financial statements, and to prepare an annual budget for consideration at each Annual Business meeting. The Treasurer will be responsible for forwarding a current membership list, or new and renewing members, to the Editor of the newsletter.

Section Six. The duties fo the two Officers-at-Large are to supervise the various standing committees including, but not limited to, the Membership Committee, Special Projects Committee and Tex-Prep Committee, but not including the Nominating and Program Committees. In addition, a designated Officer-at-Large shall serve as Editor of a regular newsletter to the membership. The Editor will prepare summaries of Committee workshops and compile information of interest to Committee members.

Section Seven. Each Officer will prepare a written annual report for presentation at the Annual Business meeting. All outgoing Officers will have their files in order and ready to deliver to the new Officers at the conclusion of the Annual Business meeting.

Workshop Review for 1996

Workshops sponsored by the CMC scheduled for 1996 begin with the January 27th workshop focusing on Resource Sharing and Collection Management issues. Look for more information and a registration form in this newsletter. The CMC is also sponsoring the TAM Annual Meeting Preconference workshop, *Internet 101: It's Not Just For Programmers Only*. The preconference workshop costs \$40.00 and is limited to the first 25 registrants. If you find the technology overwhelming or have decided that the Net isn't relevant to a Collection Manager's job, this workshop is for you.

In early fall, September 19-22, 1996, the CMC will hold its first retreat workshop at the Winedale Historical Center. The workshop will focus on automated data management systems, and the retreat setting will allow participants hands-on time to try out a variety of software and share both successful and not-so-successful ventures into computerizing collections. Among other topics, presenters will address how to prepare collections for computerization, data entry concerns, confidentiality and security.
