



TAA 2025 annual meeting pre-show arrivals have begun! Staff is now onsite, and the first guests have arrived to find light rain and 3mph winds. The airports serving this area are all open, showing no flight delays or cancellations as of Thursday at 11:00 pm.

According to the NOAA National Hurricane Center, this area around Casa de Campo (and the entire eastern end of the Dominican Republic) is not near any watches or warnings for floods, storms or hurricane conditions. The resort is in a very insulated area, and far east of the island's mountainous terrain. While Melissa is intensifying and expected to be a major hurricane, the system is moving west, away from this area.
