This online survey was conducted by Probolsky Research from August 12 - 13, 2018 among 900 California adults. The margin of error is +/-3.3%.



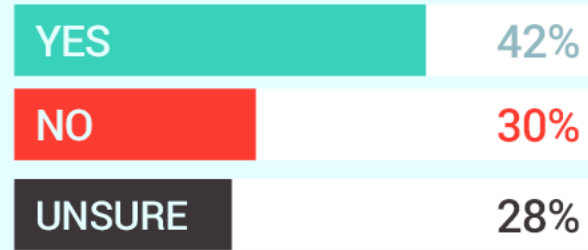

AMONG MEN



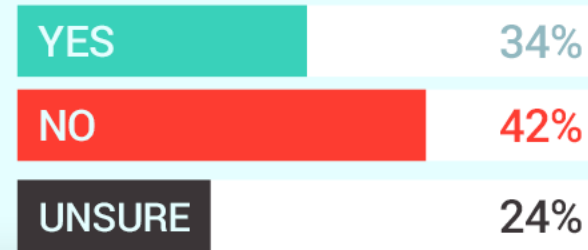
AMONG WOMEN



AMONG 18-24



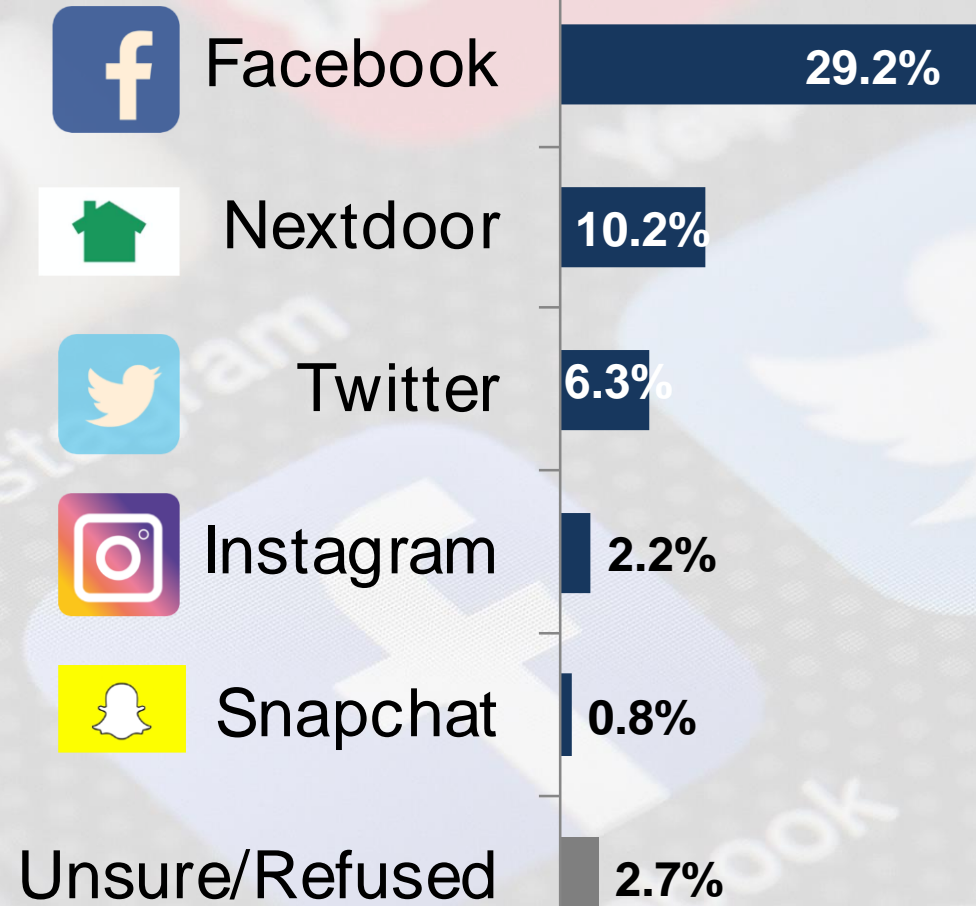

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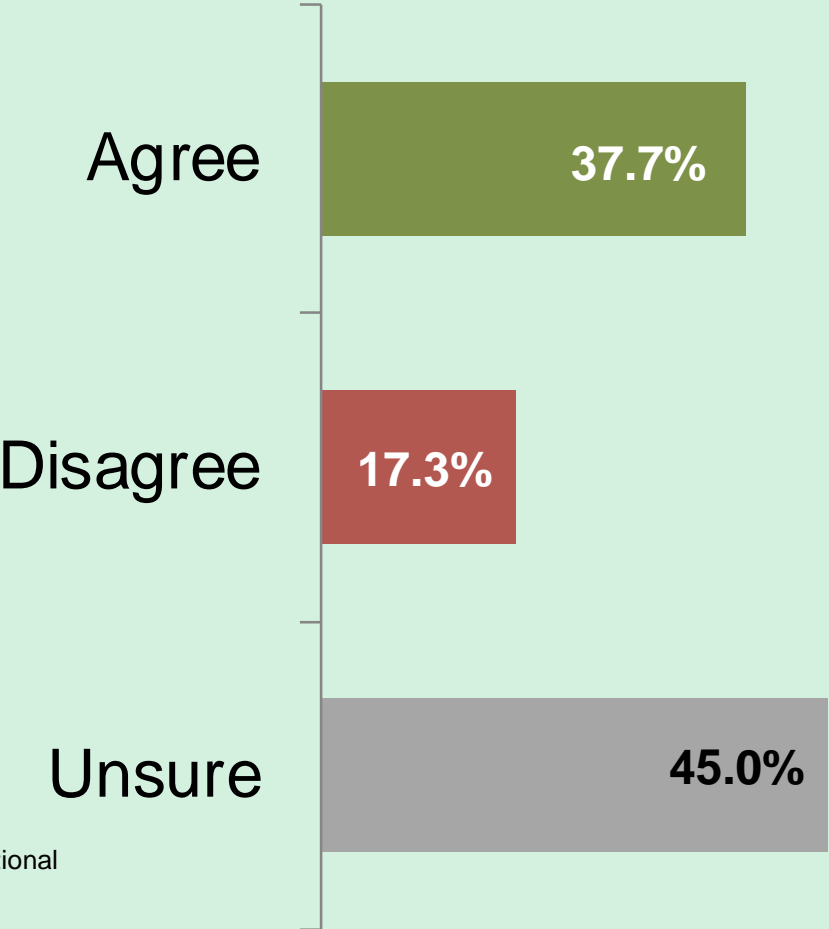


I do not use social media



From May 25 - 28, 2018, Probolsky Research conducted a live-interviewer telephone and online survey among California voters. A total of 800 voters were surveyed (360 by telephone and 440 online). A survey of this size yields a margin of error of +/-3.5%. Interviews were conducted with respondents on both landline and mobile phones (22%) and were offered in English and Spanish (2.6%) languages.

From March 16 - 18, 2018, Probolsky Research conducted a national online survey among U.S. adults. A total of 1,019 U.S. adults completed the survey by computer, tablet or smart phone.
