

## Statewide Standing Order for Naloxone Virginia Department of Health 109 Governor Street, 13th Floor Richmond, VA 23219

## **Date Issued:** February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023

The persons identified below are authorized to dispense naloxone pursuant to this standing order and in accordance with protocols by the Board of Pharmacy in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Department of Health. Additionally, this standing order authorizes a licensed pharmacy, wholesale distributor, third party logistics provider or manufacturer to distribute the naloxone formulations specified below via invoice to entities designated by this standing order in accordance with Virginia Board of Pharmacy Guidance Document §110-44.

## **Authorized Dispensers:**

The following individuals may dispense naloxone pursuant to this standing order to a person to administer to another person believed to be experiencing or about to experience a life-threatening opioid overdose and shall follow Board of Pharmacy protocol when dispensing naloxone as authorized in §54.1-3408 (X) and (Y):

- Pharmacists who maintain a current active license practicing in a pharmacy located in Virginia that maintains a current active pharmacy permit,
- Emergency medical services personnel as defined in §32.1-111.1,
- The following individuals who have completed a training program in accordance with the policies and procedures of their employer or governing entity:
  - Law-enforcement officers as defined in §9.1-101,
  - Employees of the Department of Forensic Science,
  - Employees of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner,
  - Employees of the Department of General Services Division of Consolidated Laboratory Services,
  - Employees of the Department of Corrections designated as probation and parole officers or as correctional officers as defined in §53.1-1,
  - o Employees of regional jails,
  - School nurses,
  - Other school board employees, or individuals contracted by a school board to provide school health services,
  - o Firefighters,
  - Employees of local health departments and contractors or Medical Reserve Corps volunteers acting on behalf of the local health department,
  - Employees of local community services boards,
  - Persons acting on behalf of a community based organization (CBO), harm reduction site, or other site to provide naloxone pursuant to an agreement approved by the Department of Health, and
  - Individuals acting on behalf of the American Red Cross of Virginia as a Disaster Health Services volunteer.

This order is effective for two (2) years from the date issued, unless otherwise discontinued by the Commissioner or upon his resignation, removal or retirement. Any individual dispensing naloxone pursuant to this order must maintain a copy of the standing order for two (2) years from the last date of dispensing.
