
#### Where Our Members Are

VAM is one of the largest state museum associations in the country, with an active membership from around the Commonwealth. We have over 3,000 members, and represent museums, the dedicated staff and volunteers who work in those museums, and the businesses that provide service to them. Our museums serve residents in 74 of Virginia's 95 counties.
