My Sister, the Pilot:

From Fairy Wings to Captain Wings

y sister always dreamed of flying, but not in the way most pilots do. When Emma Fox was little, she often wore sparkly wings and dreamed of fairies. Although she was more interested in theater and never thought of aviation as a career option growing up, there were many clues that she would become a pilot: her veneration for Amelia Earhart, fascination with maps, and studious intelligence.

It just took one intro flight to turn a theater star into a plane-preoccupied pilot. She

turned her focus on aviation with a force like a jet engine. Aviation knowledge and terms streamed from her bright, inquisitive mind. Her enthusiasm was contagious.

The first time Emma piloted me into the skies just the two of us, we were squeezed into a hot, tiny Piper Archer. She expertly turned knobs and manipulated levers. The door didn't completely shut before takeoff, and I was *terrified* that the loud rushing wind would whip me out of the airplane. I didn't let my fear impede the breath-taking views of majestic mountains below or the feeling of awe watching my sister confidently steer us toward the endless horizon.

At Westminster College, Emma committed herself to work, classes, and flight training. Earning the required flight hours relied on Utah's fickle weather and demanded skill, flexibility, and luck. Undeterred by overload-



ed schedules and unexpected storms, she maneuvered around setbacks like she adeptly navigates planes. Emma graduated early and joined the small percentage of female airline pilots.

Despite her busy schedule, Emma always found time to volunteer in my classroom and engage our community. She ignited her same passion in others as a flight instructor, camp counselor, and museum aviation educator. As vice president of the WAI Utah Chapter, she had unprecedented attendance at the local Girls in Aviation Day event. She even persuaded the mayor to declare that day a local holiday.

Emma continues to help others today as pilot and manager for Horizon Air's mentor program. I couldn't be prouder as I continue to watch her soar to higher heights still wearing shiny wings, but these ones are for captains.

uring this time last year, I was in my last semester of undergrad at Rutgers University-New Brunswick. While everyone was applying for jobs, I was trying to figure out my next steps to elevate my aviation journey. Attending my first conference last year was life-changing for me, the three-day event gave me countless opportunities. I was able to make connections with people all around the world, learn about different career paths in aviation (not just piloting), and listen to such strong and accomplished women which gave me the encouragement that I needed to chase my dreams. As a former attendee and now a staff member, here are my tips on how to make the most out of #WAI2023 this week!

5 Top Tips

- 1. We have a long three days ahead of us, and to absorb as much information and experience as possible, don't skimp out on breakfast! Studies show that those who have a hearty breakfast are more likely to retain information and attention throughout the day. If you don't have time for a full meal, get a fruit and a granola bar at the Long Beach Convention Center to start off the day! See the map on Page 10.
- 2. Make a non-negotiable list for each day! Write down which education sessions, tours, and/or activities you want to attend each day. This way you'll have a schedule with times and places and won't feel as lost. And make use of your free time by checking out the exhibit hall. We have 196 exhibitors this year!
- 3. Each issue of *The Daily* is a great resource for the next three days. It has the entire program overview with notable stories from current and past conference attendees. I like to use it as an agenda, by crossing off which sessions I've attended and circling the ones I want to stop by.
- 4. Mentorship is one of the many benefits of being a member at WAI. Take advantage of this resource by opting-in to our new Mentor Connect program. You can be a mentor or find a mentor.
- 5. Try to sit with someone new for each meal. There are 4,000 attendees registered for the WAI2023 conference. I've found that some of the best connections I've made with people are through casual conversation.

Don't forget to take pictures! The conference may only last three days, but the pictures will last a lifetime. If you post any pictures or videos, don't forget to tag us and #WAI2023 for a chance to get featured.

I am expecting this year to be completely different as a staff member than it was for me last year. But after seeing all the new things we have planned and the hard work that each of our team members has put in, I can tell you first-hand that this year's conference will be the best yet.

Visit the Rosie the Riveter Park

Long Beach, California isn't just home for the WAI2023 conference, it was also once home to the Navy and naval shipyards during World War II. During

this time, women were called to work in shipyards, defense plants, and factories, which started the iconic figure we know as "Rosie the Riveter."


The Douglas Aircraft Plant—once the largest employer in Long Beach—employed thousands of riveters at the time who helped the production of military aircraft. To honor the women here in Long Beach and all over the United States, the three-acre park beside the former aircraft manufacturing plant is named Rosie the Riveter Park.

The memorial at the park is a tribute to those who served in the military during WWII and the WASP with the phrase "All Gave Some and Some Gave All" etched on the stones.

Take a self-guided tour of Rosie the Riveter Park through radio podcasts and 1940s music while you walk through the memorial.

The park is located at 4900 E. Conant Street, in Long Beach. For more information, visit www.visitlongbeach.com/directory/long-beach-rosie-the-riveter-park-and-interpretive-center/.


WAI Intern Insights


