Educate Yourself About Air Traffic Control

A ir traffic control can be mysterious or even intimidating to some aviators. Come and chat with an air traffic controller today from 1:45-2:45 p.m. in 102 B to learn the tricks of how to best communicate in the air, as well as ways to increase your safety as you fly in the national airspace system.

As pilots, it can be difficult to understand all that goes into keeping air traffic moving. As a CFI and air traffic controller, **Heather McNevin** likes to

teach both groups about the other. This seminar will provide an overview of air traffic system operation. Heather will then sharpen her focus on how delays are managed in the system.

No matter the type of flying you do, Heather can offer operating tips that will help you operate smoothly in the national airspace system. You'll even learn how to check for ATC traffic management initiatives from your phone! Talking with Heather you'll uncover ATC's great mysteries, what it's like being a controller, what her inner monologue is saying when she's controlling, and why you can't always get that shortcut you've requested.

This is an educational seminar that promises something useful for all pilots, from students to ATPs! If you like rock and roll music, want to hear ATC stories, and are interested in learning how to check for traffic constraints from your phone, come hang out for an hour and learn from an expert.

She was the first woman to fly the F-16 combat missions. After her military retirement, Sharon went on to fly as a captain with Southwest Airlines. Lt. Col **Rochelle Kimbrell**, retired from the USAF after 22 years of service. She attended the United States Air Force Academy and graduated from F-16 training to become the first Black American female fighter pilot.

Blaze is a retired combat veteran who was the first female Reserve officer to fly for the USAF Air Demonstration Squadron (Thunderbirds) and the first woman to qualify to fly in the new T-7A Red Hawk. You will also find Blaze at the Texas Women's University booth 602 where the WASP are also represented, and she serves on the board of directors.

"My youngest daughter Jerica LOVED dresses. At the age of six she was asked to be the flower girl in her cousin's wedding. She was given a beautiful purple dress to wear, which



she absolutely loved. Over time she outgrew it. Running a nonprofit I encouraged her to donate it so someone else could benefit from it. She reluctantly agreed and off the dress went to the Philippines. That was a beginning," said Wendy Bird, founder, Pearls with Purpose.

Today, Wendy has established Pearls With Purpose (**booth 556**) in Kenya, the Dominican Republic, and Peru manufacturing jewelry in seven countries and empowering 680 women artisans with training and education that helps them to break the cycle of poverty in their families. That is their unique spin on micro-enterprise.

As the on the ground trainer she has witnessed first hand that everyone has a desire to contribute back to self, family and community regardless of their culture, ethnicity or education.
