

During Women in Aviation Week (March 4-10, 2024), the CAE branch in Morristown, New Jersey, hosted prospective female pilots and 99s New Jersey chapter members.

Maria Choi, a CAE flight instructor and event organizer, shared her aviation journey and how welcoming CAE has been to her as she comes from an international background where English is her third language. "Sometimes people don't understand my accent, but at CAE everyone is understanding, and they take the time to learn with me."

Zekiye Memis, also shared her journey of moving from Turkey to become a simulator technician before being promoted to regulatory compliance specialist at CAE. She also shared information on different career paths in aviation aside from the Part 121 path.

Maria gave attendees a tour of the facility as well as stopping by active classrooms to see how the instructors engage with their stu-

dents. Attendees were also able to try the King Air 350, Citation Sovereign, and Sikorsky S-76 simulators. Some of the attendees shared that being able to fly the simulators was motivating about what the end goal could look like.






