



As a flight attendant, you will ensure the safety of our passengers, as well as providing the best possible customer experience, while onboard our aircraft. Your responsibilities include: caring for our passengers, along with customer service duties such as serving meals and drinks. This is a dynamic and exciting position that allows you to travel, meet new challenges, and be invigorated every day as you portray the essence of SkyWest to our customers, our people!



Essential Duties and Responsibilities

SkyWest operates flights every day of the year, requiring flight attendants to work a rotating schedule with variable hours that include holidays and weekends. Flight attendants need to have the stamina needed to work up to 16 hours per day with frequent change in climate and weather conditions. The flight attendant position requires travel on a constant basis with exposure to air turbulence, dry air, varying noise levels from aircraft engines and working in confined spaces.



Minimum Requirements

- Posses a high school diploma or GED
- Be at least 21 years of age
- Be between 5'0" and 6'0" *without shoes* (due to the internal size of our aircraft, there are no exceptions)
- Can walk and fit comfortably down the aircraft aisle while facing forward, fit quickly through the over-wing exit, and sit in the Flight Attendant jump seat without modification or a seatbelt extension
- Capable of opening exits and closing aircraft doors weighing up to 45 pounds and pushing/pulling beverage carts weighing up to 250 pounds
- Willing to provide proof of a US or foreign passport, are willing to obtain a US or foreign passport (including applicable visas, if necessary) with the ability to travel in/out of the US, Canada, Mexico, and the Bahamas without restriction prior to attending Initial New Hire Training
- Willing to relocate to any of SkyWest's 19 crew domiciles
- Agree to wear a uniform compliant face mask/covering if required
- Able to effectively manage allergies including but not limited to nuts, animals, latex gloves, perfumes, cleaning solvents, fumes, dust, pet dander, etc.
- Have excellent communication skills and proficiency in speaking, reading and writing English
- Comfortable resolving passenger situations including disorderly passengers and medical emergencies
- Able to pass a DOT/FAA pre-employment drug test and background investigation
- Able to provide effective leadership, direction and assistance in emergency and non-emergency situations
- Be a dependable, reliable and prompt employee
- If hired, be able to attend 32 days paid training in Salt Lake City, Utah
