

Teaching Long Term Self-Reliance

was in the process of getting my private certificate in 2010 and joined the Utah Ninety-Nines club. When they learned about my non-profit, Pearls With Purpose, they were enthused at the opportunity to impact womens' lives in developing countries. They recommended I attend a WAI conference to gather the support of other socially-minded women in the aviation industry.

Since 2002, PWP has been achieving sustainable self-reliance for women rescued from sex trafficking in the Dominican Republic, Peru, India, Cambodia, Philippines, and Guatemala. Through ongoing mentorship, vocational training, and micro-grants—disadvantaged individuals are given hope, dignity, and a hand-up. The most popular vocational training is jewelry making with supplies locally sourced from each country. They include beautiful Grade A quality pearls from the Philippines, larimar from the Dominican Republic, and semi-precious gemstones from India.

To date more than 380 women have been trained in this artisan skill. The women utilize wire-wrapping techniques along with sterling silver and 10K gold to create unique and timeless pieces. Our focus is on product movement—and long-term self-reliance—so each piece is affordably priced. You will feel good about this guilt-free indulgence knowing 72% goes back and 28% is used for marketing and social awareness. Pearls With Purpose focuses on bringing humanity back into consumerism.

Our focus at this week's conference is to move 500 pieces of jewelry and raise over \$15,000 in funds for our new co-ops opening in Africa in March—all donations are 100% tax exempt.






