WAI Board Welcomes Members at WAI2022 in Nashville

The 2022 WAI membership meeting yesterday was officially opened by WAI Board Chair Linda Markham who highlighted the enthusiasm and energy of members gathering in person again since WAI2020 in Orlando. She introduced WAI CEO Allison McKay who noted this week's conference will have record attendance in the organization's history, dozens of education sessions, inspiring keynote speakers, an array of professional development seminars and workshops, and a total of \$468,080 scholarship awards. WAI membership is now at 15,000 members with more than 800 international members from 90 countries.

Allison also shared internal WAI milestones with new technology coming to the organization's membership database and website, new staff members Stephanie Kenyon, chief growth officer, and Patt Poinsett, director of operations and finance. A new internship program has been launched with details on opportunities on WAI's Jobs Connect, and new WAI staff positions will also be announced.

Board Secretary Michaela Lucas announced the board election results with Linda Markham, Rhonda Larance, and Shannon Weidenkamp reelected for three-year terms, and Kathy Yodice was voted in for a threeyear board member term.

New WAI Membership Rates Effective June 1, 2022

Simplifying categories and encouraging Junior Members 18 years old and younger with free membership

During yesterday's WAI Annual Membership Meeting, new membership levels were announced effective June 1, 2022. Corporate Membership to WAI will be \$500 per year and include up to 5 individual memberships from the same company.


Other changes coming to WAI membership this year, as of June 1 include:

- FREE membership for Junior Members (members 18 years old and younger)
- Embracing the "INTERNATIONAL" in the WAI name, the small upcharge for members outside of the United States will be eliminated. As of June 1, dues for all Individual members regardless of location will be \$44/ year (\$49/year without auto-renewal).
- Family members residing at the same mailing address may be added to an Individual membership for \$15/year (\$20/year without auto-renewal).

- Dues for students who are enrolled full-time in college, university, or other vocational program (including fulltime enrollment in Part 141 flight schools) will be \$24/ year (\$29/year without auto-renewal).
- Lifetime membership may be purchased by any member for \$1,500 (regardless of the member's age)
- A spouse may also add on a Lifetime membership for \$300.
- Any member may request digital-only communication at any time; however, there is no discount for this option.

"We believe these changes will simplify our membership levels, bring an increased level of service and value to our Junior Members and those just getting started, and will help expand membership benefits across the globe," says Molly Martin, director of member engagement.

Safety First

For Today's Luncheon Speaker, NTSB Chair Jennifer Homendy

ational Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) Chair Jennifer Homendy's path to her current position was through a maze of hazards, literally. From 2004 to 2018, before her original appointment to the NTSB, she served as the Democratic staff director of the Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials, which is under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the United States House of Representatives. After her confirmation to chair last August, Chair Homendy has had the opportunity to be on scene at a myriad of accidents (not all aviation-related). She's an unwavering defender of transportation safety, having had direct impact on regulation and structural/functional refinements of pipelines and hazardous material transportation across the U.S.

The Daily editors had a chance to ask Chair Homendy a few brief questions ahead of her visit to WAI2022 in Nashville.

1. You're following in the footsteps of a few fine men and women at the NTSB.

What is the one quality you feel has helped the most in your career rise to this toplevel executive position in government?

"Don't be afraid to go for it! It can be uncomfortable to take on new challenges. All too often, that fear can paralyze us and prevent us from rising to the occasion, taking on new challenges, and growing, personally and professionally. I like to say, get comfortable with being uncomfortable."

2. We are so thrilled your daughter Lexi can join you at the conference. Is there a particular reason why she wants to come explore our WAI conference?

"Lexi loves all things aerospace—her future is sky-high, if you'll excuse the pun! Her dream job is to work on scientific experiments on the International Space Station. She knows what she wants and I'm so proud of her ambition. She also hopes to inspire other girls in aviation to follow their passions."

3. You seem really happy to have Lexi along at the conference today. Is it special to have her with you at work?



"My job takes me away from home a lot, so I'm always looking for creative ways to spend more time with my daughter while inspiring her to follow her dreams. While not all work trips are conducive to family time, Lexi and I were both thrilled by WAI's invitation to attend such an inspiring event."

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
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Hundreds of chapter members celebrated returning to our in person Chapter Reception on Wednesday evening.

For Lauren Beam, one of several jet pilots who participated in yesterday's Be A Mentor, Find A Mentor session (Sponsored by CAE) inspiration came from the Wings Over Houston Airshow at Ellington Field, where she saw women flying loops, rolls and spins. "Jessy Panzer and Debbie Rihn helped me realize that my dream of becoming a female pilot was attainable," she says. Lauren's degree in engineering helped her build essential skills that transferred well in her aviation career.

When she heard of the launch of Southwest Airlines Destination 225 Program, designed to train pilots from zero to flight deck, she jumped at the opportunity. Lauren trained at CAE Phoenix, and is now a first officer for XOJET Aviation flying the Challenger 300/350. She's also a CAE Women in Flight Ambassador and one of several WAI members here to mentor others this week at #WAI22. The CAE ambassador was bolstered at the session by two Boeing employees, Amber Kemmerling, an airplane systems engineer and Jeremy Rodgers, knowledge management systems strategy leader.

Pearls of Wisdom

WAI *Daily* staff had a moment to sit with Friday General Session speaker Niloofar Rahmani, first fixed-wing Afghani female Air Force pilot, who offered us a few quick pearls of wisdom.

WAI: Your story is so inspiring for WAI members who are encountering challenges getting support from friends and family in their efforts to become part of the aviation community. What do you want them to remember after hearing you speak at WAI?

Niloofar: I would like for them to remember that life is a journey of happiness and sadness. Not every day is happy and not every day is sad. When it is sad just be patient. You only fail if you guit.

WAI: Was there a single mentor in your life who really made the difference in your ability to succeed as a military pilot? Or were there a succession of mentors?

Niloofar: As an Afghan woman I had my father

as a mentor and supporter. He always pushed me to do more and fight for my rights in a country where the dream of flying was initially impossible for me.

WAI: Women worldwide are slowly being exposed to the opportunities that exist for careers in aviation. What can American and European women do to help encourage the next generation worldwide?

Niloofar: We should provide more opportunities for those who are dreaming to fly but are unable financially to afford it. We need to provide more scholarships and opportunities that will encourage more young girls to go after their dreams that they might think are impossible.


